



URBAN OASIS A peaceful retreat just minutes from Canterbury city centre offering convenience, beautifully configured interiors, striking Kentish-style streetscenes and a calming waterside setting. A BRIGHT FUTURE

Kingsbrook Park is set to reap the benefits of being situated within a key regeneration area of Canterbury.

The redevelopment of the Kingsmead area in Canterbury which incorporates Kingsbrook Park, proposes a mix of housing, commercial and leisure improvements as well as a new hotel and office facilities. Further education, training, sports, youth and childcare facilities will contribute to the area's future as a vibrant community.

The £47 million redevelopment of Canterbury College is one of the largest educational developments in the country, and is a further example of Canterbury's potential to become a city of European importance*

The riverside corridor is central to the area, providing a strong linear focus to the development and a stunning vista towards Canterbury Cathedral. Views of local landmarks such as this will be carefully protected and enhanced during the city's regeneration, to ensure that the unique character and heritage of the city is preserved.
























VIBRANT CITY LIVING



JOIN THE CLUB

For those who enjoy an active lifestyle, Canterbury and the surrounding area provide an array of leisure pursuits.







Merely 2.3 miles from Kingsbrook Park is Canterbury Golf Club, which boasts an 18-hole course surrounded by attractive woodland, a driving range, clubhouse and pro shop. All this comes at an affordable cost and, being just down the road from Kingsbrook Park, provides an excellent opportunity to perfect your swing. For the more experienced golfer, Royal St George's Golf Club in Sandwich is located just 14 miles from Canterwbury. Situated alongside Sandwich Bay, this prestigious, world-renowned Links course hosted the Open Championship in 2003 and provides outstanding views across the English Channel.


Situated on the stunning Kent coast, but still within easy reach, are Whitstable and Herne Bay, which are seven and eight miles from Kingsbrook Park respectively. These picturesque seaside towns provide the ideal location and conditions for sailing, and are home to the Whitstable Yacht Club and the Herne Bay Sailing Club. Whether you are an eager beginner or an experienced helmsman, training and membership are offered by each of these clubs, where you will receive a warm welcome.

From life on the open seas, to life by the lakes and rivers. Keen anglers will be spoilt for choice by the fishing venues in the area. Local waters include Littlebourne Lakes, a short journey from Kingsbrook Park, and the 26-acre Mainline Chilham Lake which is well-stocked and only seven miles away. Fishing is also permitted on certain stretches along the Stour, which runs through Canterbury city centre.

Kent has some of the most beautiful countryside in England and the quaint villages that surround Canterbury are excellent examples of this. There are many popular walks and cycle routes between these attractive destinations, such as from Fordwich, which claims to be the smallest town in Britain, to Reed Pond. Other villages within reach include Wickambreaux, with its village green, and Bekesbourne, the home of Howletts Zoo.


For the cricket enthusiast, Kent County Cricket Club has been firmly established in Canterbury for over 160 years. Situated only two miles from Kingsbrook Park, avid cricket fans will be treated to regular high quality matches at the St Lawrence Ground, which has a capacity of 15,000. Supporters can watch Kent compete against county opposition, as well as catch the odd international and one-day match. Village green cricket also thrives around Canterbury, providing an opportunity for players and spectators alike to enjoy the quintessentially English tradition of leather on willow.

A stone's throw away from Kingsbrook Park are Kingsmead Leisure Centre and King's School Recreation Centre. Facilities on offer at these centres include swimming pools, a dance studio, multi-purpose sports halls and fitness studios equipped with a variety of machines and supervised by trained instructors.

NATURAL SELECTION

Kingsbrook Park is perfectly located to enjoy all the natural beauty of Canterbury and its surrounding countryside.

The city of Canterbury itself is home to acres of public gardens and parkland which, with their perfectly tended floral displays, provide the ideal setting from which to escape the bustle of the city and enjoy a gentle stroll or punt along the river.

Set within the Garden of England, Canterbury is surrounded by nearly 6000 hectares of woodland and has 49 Sites of Nature Conservation Interest, earning Kent its reputation as an Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty*. From stunning valleys and rolling hills to the miles of breathtaking coastline, there are a wealth of places to explore.

Travel further along Kent's magnificent stretch of coastline to uncover the beautiful coastal towns of Whitstable and Herne Bay. Famous for its oysters, Whitstable is a popular harbour town characterised by quiet lanes, weather-boarded and flint cottages and small craft shops, whilst nearby Herne Bay boasts spectacular award-winning beaches and stunning seafront gardens.

Kingsbrook Park itself is set in a uniquely calm and peaceful environment with its riverside setting, abundance of landscaped trees and natural parkland. A 2.5-acre park has also been created within the development, which will provide open green space and a children's play area. Features of the natural landscape have been retained and enhanced, including improvements to the existing river walk and maintenance of an ecological habitat zone to protect existing wildlife.

WELL CONNECTED

Kingsbrook Park is located within easy walking distance of Canterbury city centre. In addition to benefiting from excellent transport links, it is also well placed for a variety of local shops and amenities.

Travelling in and around Canterbury and its surrounding areas couldn't be simpler. From Kingsbrook Park you can enjoy a leisurely stroll into the city centre along the attractive riverside walk. For those travelling in from the outskirts, Canterbury Park and Ride bus services offer a green, cheap and fast trip into town with unlimited journeys for £2.50* per car (driver and up to six passengers). The city also has a well established bus service with buses stopping approximately every 20 minutes at nearby stops on Broad Oak Road, Sturry Road and Kingsmead Road. The city centre station provides additional services to Whitstable, Herne Bay, Margate, Ashford, Deal, Dover and Folkestone, with a National Express service operating hourly trips to London.



Kingsbrook Park is also well placed for national and nternational travel. In addition to providing services to Tonbridge, Maidstone, Ramsgate and Margate, Canterbury West Station (just a 10-minute walk from Kingsbrook Park) operates three trains per hour directly into Charing Cross as well as an hourly service into London Victoria.

Travel to London and the continent will be even quicke following the introduction of the new high speed rail lin in 2009 connecting Kent with St Pancras and the Channel Tunnel. It is anticipated that journey times will be reduced by approximately 20 minutes, putting Canterbury within comfortable commuting distance of the capital.

The city of Canterbury is already well placed for international travel. The port of Dover, Ashford International, with its Eurostar terminal, and Folkestone's Eurotunnel are all within a 30-minute drive of Kingsbrook Park. Ashford's Eurostar terminal provides connections to Paris and Brussels in 1 hour 50 minutes and 1 hour 30 minutes respectively.







By Road: Leave the M25 at junction 2 and follow signs for London, Canterbury A2, M2. Continue forward onto the M2, signposted Dover, Channel Tunnel, M2, Canterbury, Chatham. Leave the M2 at junction 7, then at the roundabout take the 4th exit onto the A2, signposted Canterbury, Channel Tunnel, Dover, A2. Continue forward along the A2 before branching left and merging onto the A2050. Next, take the 2nd exit at the roundabout, signposted University. Turn right onto the A290 and then turn left at the mini roundabout, onto Station Road West. Continue forward before taking the 2nd exit at the roundabout, and then take the 1st exit onto St Stephen's Road. Take the 2nd exit at the next roundabout before turning right into Stonebridge Road, which leads to Kingsbrook Park.

By Rail: From London's Charing Cross station, board a train for Ramsgate or Margate and alight at Canterbury West Station. The journey will take approximately 1hr 30mins. Kingsbrook Park is located less than a mile from the station.
