Hastings and Ore are minutes from the High Weald, the fourth largest AONB (Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty) in England and Wales.

With an eclectic range of independent stores and places to eat and drink, the picturesque Old Town is a huge draw. Nestled at the eastern end of Hastings, it tumbles down to the seafront where the High Street meets The Stade – home to the biggest beach-launched fishing fleet in Britain.

Here, discover the award-winning Jerwood Gallery and wander among the iconic Grade II listed net huts. Visit the Blue Reef Aquarium and Flamingo Amusement Park or take one of the two funiculars to the ruins of the castle erected by William I after his victory at the Battle of Hastings.

You can also step back in time to another age in St. Clement's Caves. Set into the hillside, learn about the colourful lives and secrets of the area's smugglers within a labyrinth of tunnels and caverns.



Over £500m has been invested in the area, including the recently opened £100m Hastings to Bexhill link road plus a new 50,000 sq m business park.

In the town centre, Priory Meadow offers a range of larger stores plus undercover parking. Less than five minutes' walk away, the University Centre, Hastings, also enjoys a central location and has been the subject of a £500,000 investment to expand and improve the campus. There are also six primary schools serving the town and a choice of secondary schools and sixth forms, plus several nearby independent schools.




A GREAT PLACE TO LIVE

Its diverse range of festivals includes a Pirates Day, four-day Jack in the Green Festival, Seafood & Wine Festival and a Beer & Wine Festival, along with Old Town Carnival week. It is home to a popular half marathon and Bonfire night is a real spectacle, with a torchlit procession and fireworks on the beach.

Local investment and the surrounding 1066 countryside also add to the appeal of Hastings and its adjoining suburb, Ore, where we have several developments.

Buyers and investors are increasingly drawn by the combination of competitive property prices and the area's projected growth in house prices. GREAT LOCATION

Hastings and Ore are served by the A21 and the A259 coast road. With neighbouring St. Leonard's-on-sea, the area is served by four railway stations; Hastings, St. Leonard's Warrior Square, West St. Leonard's and Ore, providing regular services to London Charing Cross, London Victoria, Ashford International and Brighton.

Stagecoach buses operate across the town and connect it to Rye, Eastbourne, Battle and Hawkhurst. There is also a National Express service between London Victoria and Bexhill.
