On the market for the first time in over 50 years, The Priory is an architecturally unique Grade II Listed former Gentleman's residence set within a substantial plot right in the heart of Alcester. The property itself is a much loved family home, in need of some modernisation and comprises a six double bedroomed residence, arranged over three floors.

Offering a fabulous development opportunity, in addition to The Priory itself, the large plot also comprises the former 'Priory Works' as it was known in the mid 19th century; a 70ft factory which was once one of the main needle shops of the district. It was run by Joseph Harrison and by1890 needle making had ceased, and bicycles were produced. Having not been in use since, the factory is now in need of thorough renovation and offers a purchasers a tremendous amount of scope. The plot also houses a derelict building, positioned at the end of 'Salt Box Row' in need of complete renovation, a tin workshop previously used as office space, in additional to gardens and a formal walled lawn.

The plot benefits from both front and rear access, from Priory Road itself as well as School Road and parking is available to the front but more predominantly to the rear.

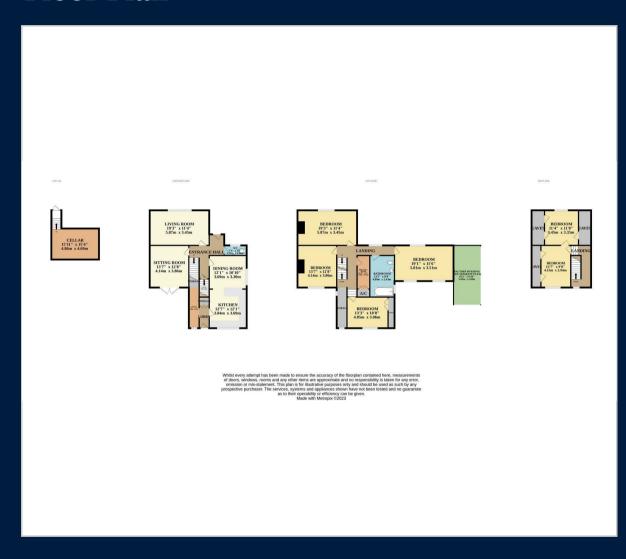

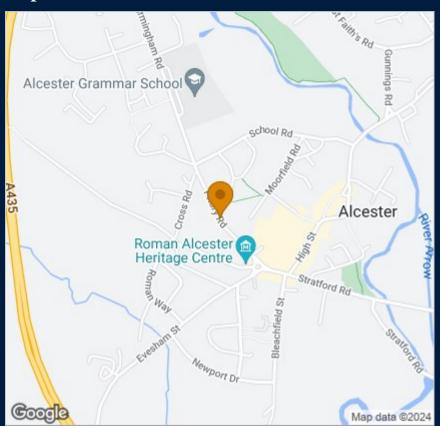

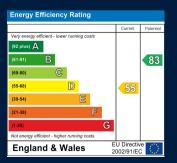
Floor Plan
