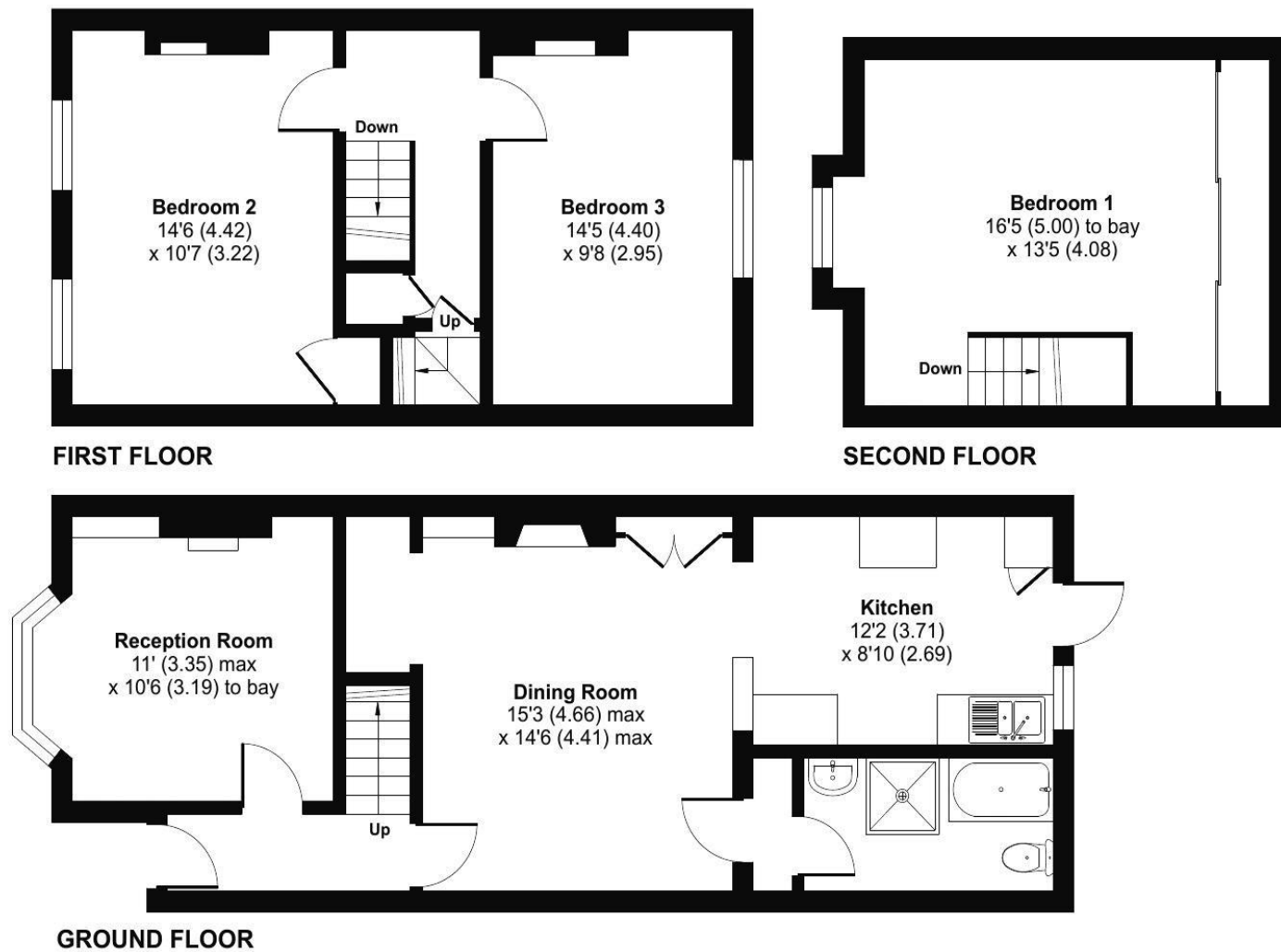

18 George Street is a delightful three bedroom terraced character home situated within walking distance of Wellington town centre. Believed to have been built in 1895, this Victorian red brick house is now in need of updating throughout and would offer an exciting opportunity for an incoming buyer.
