Location

Frenze near Diss is a picturesque corner of Norfolk on the banks of the river Frenze, a fast flowing tributary of the river Waveney. Sitting around 2.8 miles North East of Diss, a bustling market town with weekly markets in the market square. Diss sits on the Norfolk/Suffolk border and offers a surprising number of independent specialist shops and businesses providing a wide variety of goods and services, including three national brand supermarkets. The town also benefits from a mainline rail station which provides regular commuter services to Norwich, Ipswich and London Liverpool Street, located





to the east of the town centre and is within walking distance of the site. There is well regarded schooling at Diss infant, junior and high schools and there are also excellent primary schools at the nearby villages of Roydon and Bressingham. The town also offers a wide range of sporting, leisure and social activities including an 18 hole golf course and further amenities can be found at the regional retail, cultural and business centre of Norwich which lies 25 miles to the north via the A140.

The Crimea offers a rare and exciting chance to bring to life a striking contemporary home within the historic grounds of Frenze Hall. With full planning permission already granted (Ref: 2024/2735), this former agricultural railway building has been carefully reimagined by architects into a bold and distinctive rural residence. The approved plans include the transformation of the barn into a spacious, lightfilled home with vaulted ceilings, sweeping zinc roofs, exposed brick walls, and floor-to-ceiling windows that open up to the Norfolk landscape. There's scope for up to four bedrooms, generous living areas, and a flexible leisure suite featuring a pool, sauna, hot tub area. This is a home designed not just to sit in the countryside, but to be part of it—wildlife-friendly measures such as a bat roost have been integrated into the plans, along with eco-conscious features like airsource heat pump provision, sustainable drainage, and low-water-use fixtures. The site lies just minutes from the bustling market town of Diss, with fast rail links to London, yet feels a world away.
