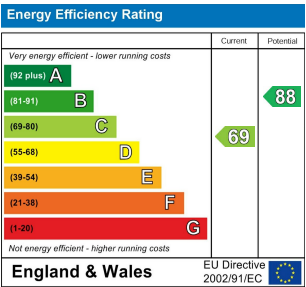

As for the location, this is an excellent spot which benefits from being between positioned between Walthamstow's much-loved Lloyd Park and all the amenities of Hoe St. You'll be spoilt for choice there when it comes to food and drink. Sodo, Shri Lakshmi and Yard Sale Pizza are all excellent choices with awards to their name.

Lloyd Park is a short hop over the road, where you'll see the William Morris Gallery at the front in all its glory. Within the grounds at the rear, you'll find landscaped gardens, a playground, tennis courts, an outdoor gym, an enclosed dog area, a

bowling club, a skatepark and two cafes, including one within the gallery that's currently operated by Deeney's, whose haggis toasties are so mouth-watering, they regularly make the national press.

You can now enjoy being just a few minutes on foot from the Soho Theatre Walthamstow, a vibrant new cultural hub bringing live performances, comedy, and events to the area.

You're also a short stroll from Europe's longest market along the High Street, where you'll find Forest Cinema and the convenient shops and eateries of 17&Central.

And if you need to travel beyond E17, it couldn't be easier; Walthamstow Central station is around 0.5 miles and is served by both the Victoria line and Weaver Overground.

- You'll find some excellent entertainment at the wonderfully eclectic Trades Hall, a favoured spot for renowned comedians to perform warm-up sets. Ye Olde Rose & Crown also puts on some excellent shows, including annual pantos. Both venues are about four mins on foot.
