Location

The Property is located within the residential suburb of Smallwood, on the edge of Redditch Town Centre.

J2 and J3 of the M42 motorway are some four and six miles to the north respectively, providing easy access to the Midlands motorway network.

Description

The Property comprises a listed, Victorian Town Church dating from 1876. The original building is constructed with coursed sandstone beneath a ridged and pitched tiled roof.

The Main Church is laid out with traditional 4-bay aisled Nave, 2-bay Chancel with north Organ Chamber and Vestry.

The building retains many original features, including stained glass windows and exposed beams.

The total GIFA is 5292 sq ft.

The building was extended in the early 1990s to include a Church Hall, WCs and Kitchen which is available by separate negotiation, please call to discuss.

Outside: The Property is set in the grounds of the Church providing ample car parking.

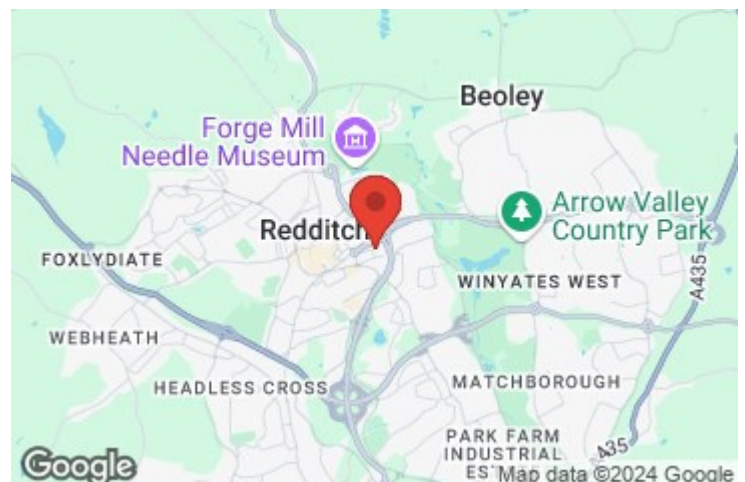
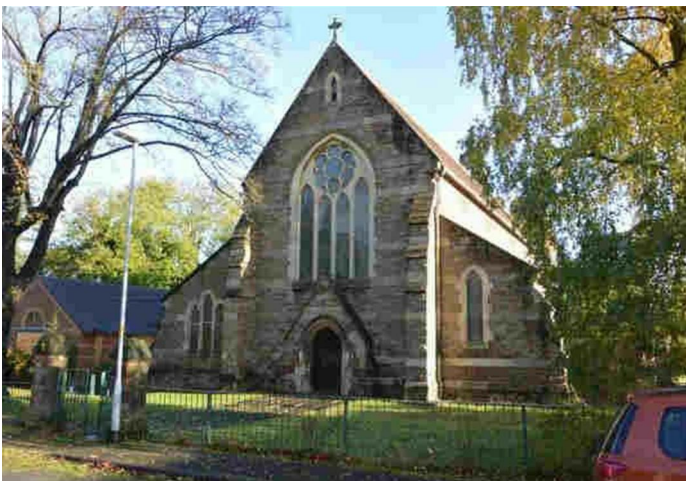
