




Market House Price Statistics



10 Year History of Average House Prices by Property Type in IP23






Maps Coal Mining

The Coal Authority has records of over 175,000 mine entries within the UK captured in the National Coal Mining database, derived from sources including abandonment plans, geological and topographical plans.

Coal mining activity is recorded as far back as the 13th century, but prior to 1872 there was no requirement to deposit abandonment plans. It is therefore believed there may be many unrecorded mine entries of which the Authority has no information or knowledge. These entries do not, therefore, appear within the Authority's national dataset as shown on this map.

This map displays nearby official conservation areas. Every local authority in England has at least one conservation area. Most are designated by the Council as the local planning authority, though Historic England and the Secretary of State also have the power to create them.





This map displays the noise levels from nearby network rail and HS1 railway routes that affect this property...



Rail Noise Data

This data indicates the level of noise according to the strategic noise mapping of rail sources within areas with a population of at least 100,000 people (agglomerations) and along Network Rail and HS1 traffic routes.

The data indicates the annual average noise levels for the 16-hour period between 0700 - 2300.

Noise levels are modelled on a 10m grid at a receptor height of 4m above ground, polygons are then produced by merging neighbouring cells within the following noise classes:



Flood Risk Rivers & Seas - Flood Risk




This map shows the chance of flooding from rivers and / or the sea, taking into account flood defences and their condition.



Risk Rating: Very low

The map does not contain sufficient information for it to be used to determine flood risk to individual properties, but it does give you an indication of whether your area may be affected by surface water flooding at this risk level.

- High Risk an area which has a chance of flooding of greater than 1 in 30 (3.3%) in any one year.
- Medium Risk an area which has a chance of flooding of greater than 1 in 100 (1.0%) in any one year.
- Low Risk an area which has a chance of flooding of greater than 1 in 1000 (0.25%) in any one year.
- Very Low Risk an area in which the risk is below 1 in 1000 (0.25%) in any one year.






Flood Risk Rivers & Seas - Climate Change



This map shows the future chance of flooding from rivers and / or the sea **between 2036 and 2069**, taking into account flood defences and their condition. The government climate change models cannot predict exactly when the chance of flooding will go up. It could happen at any time during the time period.

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Flood Risk Surface Water - Flood Risk




This map shows the chance of flooding where rainwater has nowhere to drain. This kind of flooding can occur far from rivers or seas.









Environment Radon Gas



What is Radon?

Radon is a natural radioactive gas, which enters buildings from the ground. Exposure to high concentrations increases the risk of lung cancer. The UK Health Security Agency (UKHSA) recommends that radon levels should be reduced in homes where the annual average is at or above 200 becquerels per cubic metre (200 Bq/m3).








Local Area Road Noise





This data indicates the level of noise according to the strategic noise mapping of road sources within areas with a population of at least 100,000 people (agglomerations) and along major traffic routes. This indicates a 24 hour annual average noise level with separate weightings for the evening and night periods.

Noise levels are modelled on a 10m grid at a receptor height of 4m above ground, polygons are then produced by merging neighbouring cells within the following noise classes:


