

# Brushed with the past. Designed for the future.


In 1883 the Institute of Painters in Water Colour was based in this building, just across the road from the Royal Academy.

Now behind the canvas of its classical portland stone façade, Princes House has been artfully transformed.


Today it's a space to create. Here, the highest quality contemporary office space is enhanced by a soaring statement atrium. An exhibition of good taste that always impresses.
