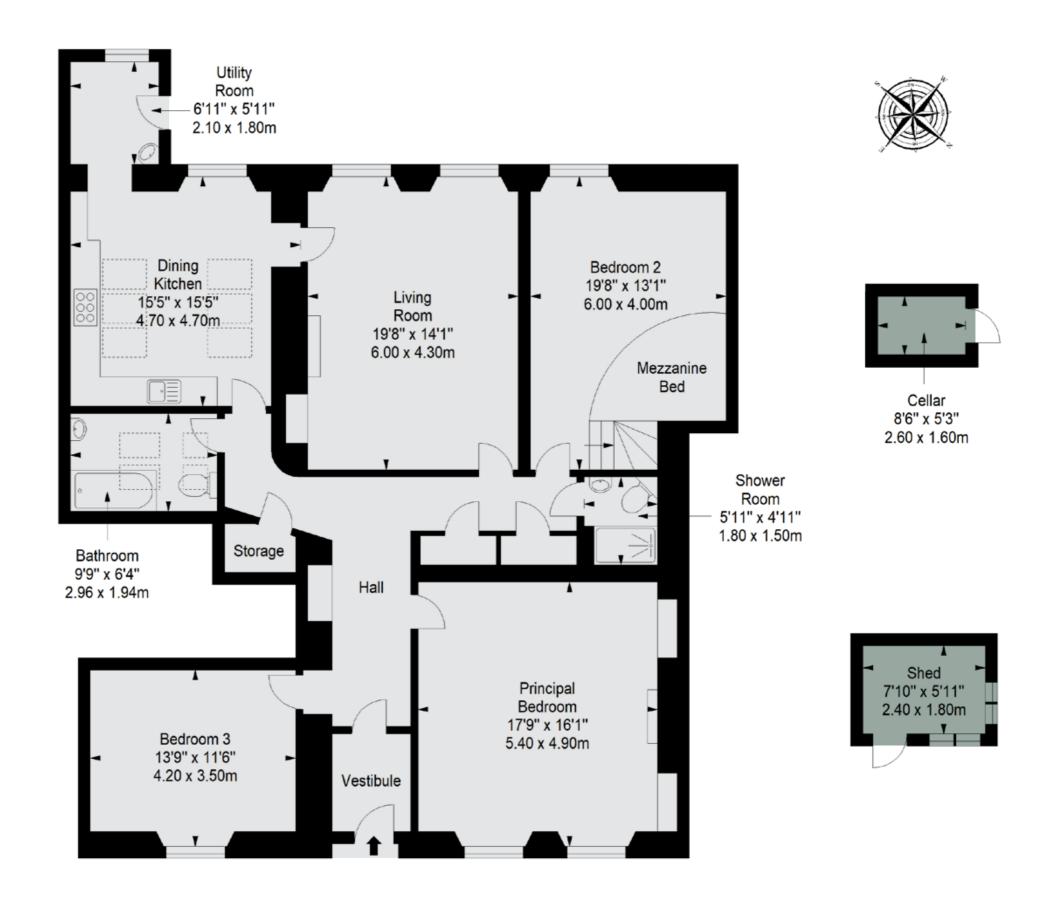

A unique, C-listed (Grade III) main-door garden apartment in the heart of Bruntsfield, with delightful private front and rear gardens, two impressive reception rooms, three large double bedrooms, and two stylish bathrooms, offering around 1800 square feet of impressive accommodation. Set within the Marchmont, Meadows and Bruntsfield Conservation Area, this C-listed (Grade III) three-bedroom main-door garden apartment, dating from 1864, forms part of an elegant sandstone terrace whose classical façade speaks of quiet grandeur and enduring beauty.

# Where charm, light and proportion are in abundance

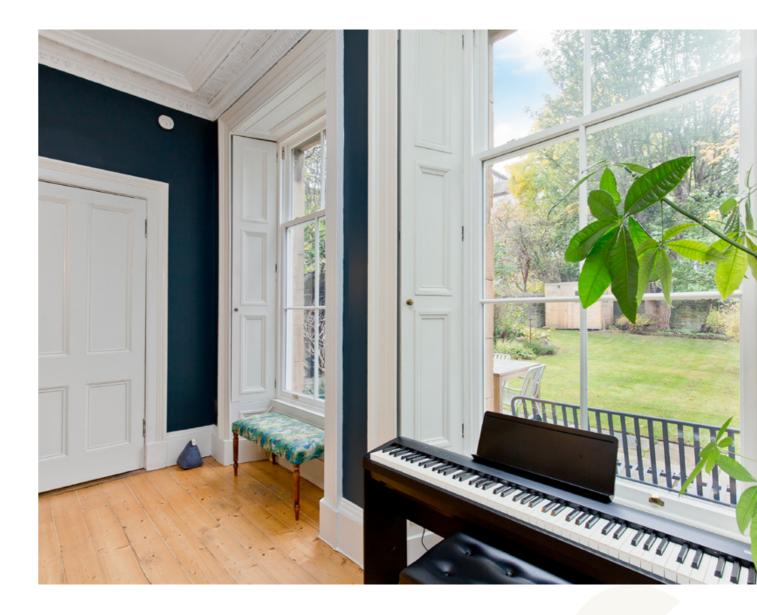
rom the moment you step through the private gate and along the rose-lined path flanked by lawns, soft planting and fruit trees, you feel a sense of seclusion in the heart of the city. The path leads to the original front door set beneath refined stone lintels. Stepping inside, the vestibule instantly reveals the home's character: original Victorian mosaic tiles in an intricate geometric pattern that celebrates 19th-century craftsmanship. The welcoming reception hallway makes a grand yet warm impression. Here, the high ceilings edged with immaculate dentil cornicing, deep skirting boards, a press, restored floorboards, and three large storage cupboards, beautifully showcases the period features and contemporary décor of this city home.







## A space to gather and unwind



he living room is the architectural heart of the home where you will find space, grandeur and intimacy. Oversized and southwest-facing, the twin sash windows frame leafy garden views, their conservation double glazing preserving both warmth and authenticity. A white

marble fireplace with a wood-burning stove is a focus point, flanked by an original Edinburgh press, used as a library and log store. Painted in a rich royal blue, the walls provide a dramatic counterpoint to the pale marble and joinery, enhanced by intricate egg-and-dart cornicing and deep skirting boards. A connecting door leads directly to the dining kitchen, creating a natural flow between the home's two principal living spaces, perfect for both everyday family life and seamless entertaining.





# The dining kitchen is a masterpiece of light and proportion





Marble worktops, open shelving and traditional brass fittings blend timeless design with practical functionality. At its centre stands a professional Rangemaster cooker with twin ovens, a grill and five-ring gas hob, ideal for the keen cook or host who loves to entertain.

The dining area accommodates six to eight guests comfortably, its scale perfect for gatherings and family meals.

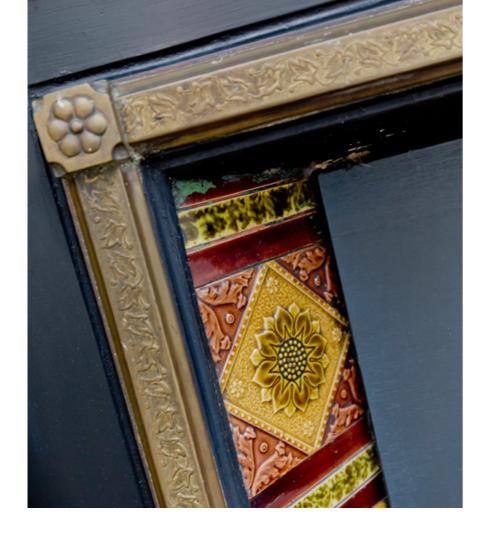
Underfloor heating ensures that the tiled room is kept at a pleasant temperature throughout the year.

A half-open passage connects to the utility room, which continues the kitchen cabinetry. Here, you will find space for a double American-style fridge-freezer, washer, and dryer. A glazed door opens directly onto the patio and garden, allowing easy access for summer dining or tending to the garden.









# The principal bedroom occupies the grand front corner of the apartment

The principal bedroom occupies the grand front corner of the apartment and exudes quiet sophistication with its restrained interior design. The king-sized room offers ample space for bedroom furniture, while the twin sash windows (with working shutters) frame views to the front garden, allowing the room to be flooded with gentle morning light. A marble fireplace sits proudly at the centre,

flanked by two presses. The soft clotted-cream palette enhanced by light blue create a sense of calm, while thick carpet underfoot provides tactile comfort.











o the rear of the property lies a second double bedroom, overlooking the private southwest-facing rear garden. It is a generous and flexible space, complete with built-in wardrobes, shelving and a clever mezzanine sleeping platform that doubles as a child's adventure loft, sleeping quarter or a creative reading perch. The muted décor and thick carpet lend warmth, while conservation double glazing ensures peace and quiet. The third bedroom, currently serving as a guest room and home office, sits at the front of the property. Its lofty

ceiling, neutral and inky palette, and natural light create an inspiring environment for both work and rest. Like every room in the apartment, it retains its original architectural detailing, offering a sense of continuity throughout.

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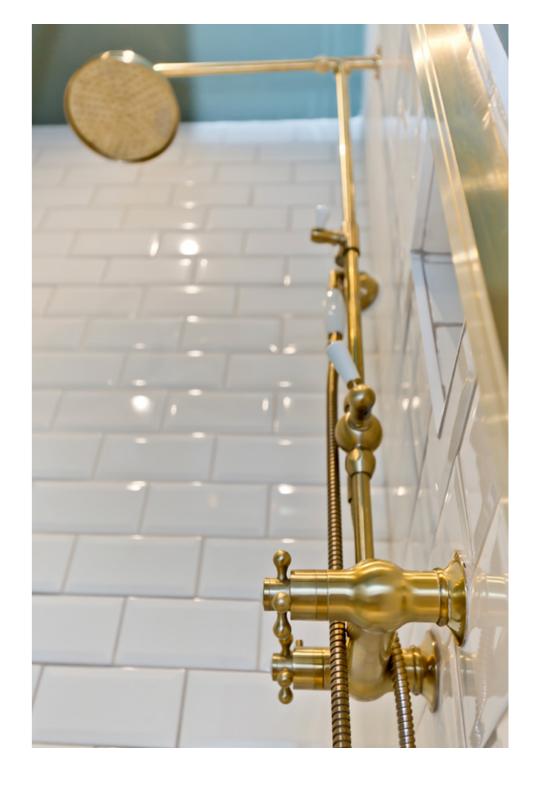
Both the bathroom and the shower room benefit from underfloor heating. The newly fitted main bathroom is a masterclass in colour, light and proportion. Beneath its vaulted ceiling, four skylights flood the room with natural light, illuminating the mustard-coloured tongue-and-groove panelling and hand-fired blue and white tiles that line the walls. A freestanding shaker-style vanity in slate grey, paired with polished chrome fittings and a matching mirrored cabinet, offers symmetry and style, while open timber shelves introduce warmth and texture. A rainfall shower over the full-sized bath completes this uplifting room.







The home features two beautifully appointed bathrooms, each distinct in character with design harmony



he shower room, also renewed by the current owners, showcases design excellence on a more intimate scale. White metro tiles and painted walls are balanced by a geometric black-and-white mosaic floor. The walk-in shower enclosure, framed in brushed brass with a rainfall shower, adds a subtle note of luxury, while a curved pedestal basin, mirrored cabinet and wooden display shelf maximise space with elegance.

The private outdoor spaces form a harmonious extension of the home, where every window looks onto private and mature greenery. To the rear, a fully enclosed southwestfacing garden offers remarkable privacy, framed by in sun all day long, a generous paved patio provides the perfect setting for al fresco dining, surrounded by lawn, plant beds and a collection of fruit trees, including; apple, shed for up to four bicycles can be found.

# BRUNTSFIELD





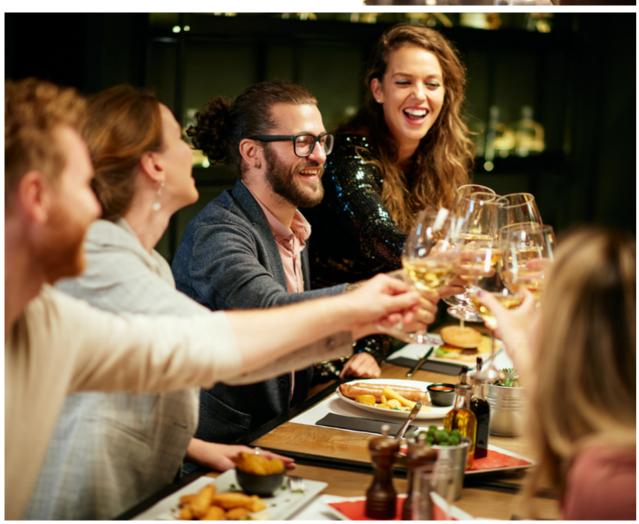

For higher education, Napier University, the University of Edinburgh and the Edinburgh College of Art are all also within easy reach on foot. Evenings in Bruntsfield are marked by understated conviviality, with wine bars, artisan bistros and intimate restaurants filled with life. In summer, the area hosts open-air events and festivals, attracting both local and international visitors. Neighbouring Morningside, with its boutique shops, luxury cinema and specialist food stores (including a Waitrose and M&S), adds yet another layer of convenience, ensuring that everything from fine dining to family essentials is close at hand. With its village atmosphere, leafy parks and proximity to the city's cultural and financial districts, Bruntsfield offers a lifestyle that is vibrant and deeply rooted in its community.

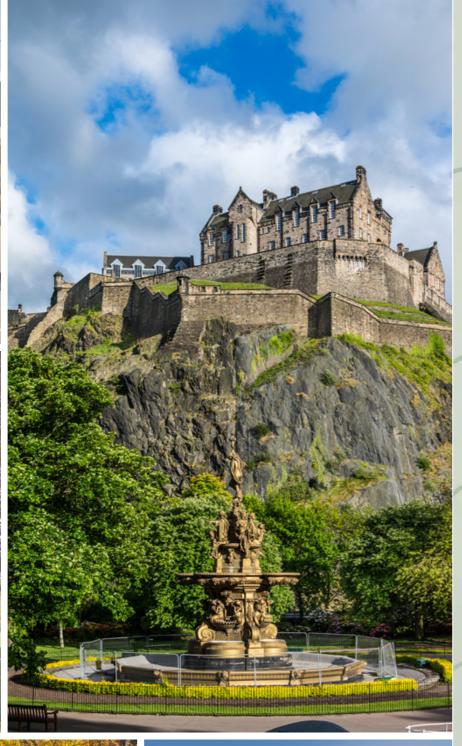






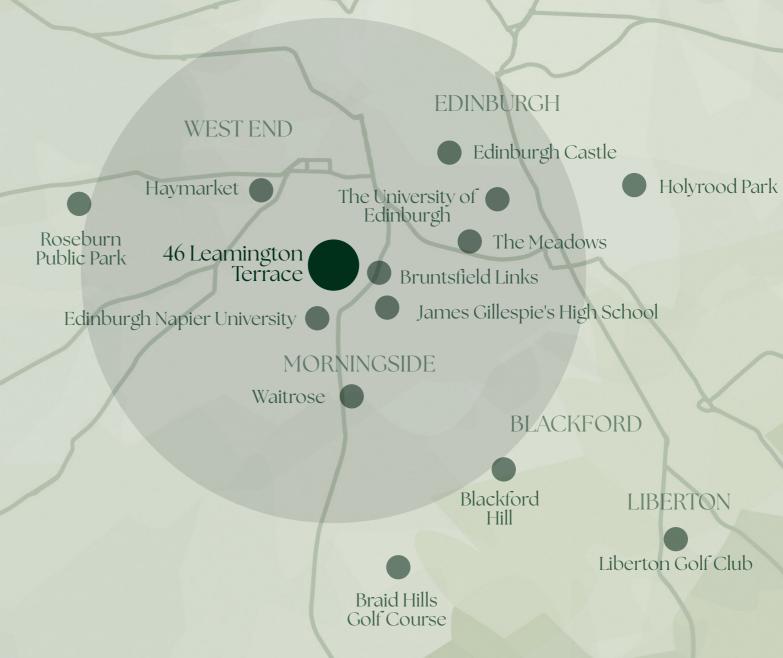
