
The property provided the family more space than they had previously enjoyed, in a peaceful environment within a small and friendly community, very much on the outer fringes of this popular village.

The dining room extension was designed for entertaining and has been the setting for many gatherings of family and friends over the years, all enjoying the warmth of 'High Trees' hospitality.






