



Step through your private entrance and head up to the first floor, where you'll find a bright reception room stretching nearly 17 feet. Natural light pours in through a beautiful bay window, while a further sash window adds to the glow. The soft carpet underfoot and original fireplace create a warm, inviting space, with built-in shelving and a rustic wooden cupboard neatly tucked into the alcove for practical storage.

Next door, the main bedroom is cosy and full of personality, with deep teal walls, a vibrant floral feature wall, and leafy views to greet you each morning.
