S et on the far eastern edge of the village, Orchard Barn is perfectly arranged for modern family life with an abundance of flexible living and entertaining space, with wonderful countryside views and just a short walk or cycle to both Burnham Market and Holkham Estate.

Fronting Gong Lane, which provides a pleasurable stroll to Burnham Overy Staithe, Orchard Barn is a property that from its outset has naturally and immediately blended into the village aesthetic as if it had always been a part of Burnham Overy Town.

The entrance hallway, with useful cupboard for boot storage, leads into the

the vast kitchen with its central island.

Although a separate and defined space, the opening through to the dining and family room gives this combined area an easy and sociable flow to the house, with bi-fold doors opening out to the patio and garden inviting the outside in. The kitchen also has access to an adjacent utility room, leading through to the ground floor shower room.

Leading from the dining room and the kitchen, you enter a double height hall with a cathedral window. The central stairway leads to the upper landing area, with a spectacular view over the Holkham Estate farmland.





Finally, at the far end of the house is the sitting room, which is not only generous in size, but also perfectly in proportion to the other attributes of this property. This room has both a stylish log burner for cosy winter evenings in, as well as french doors out to the west facing patio and garden for al fresco summer nights.

"Relax in the sitting room, listening to the crackle of the log burner."
















Take the central stairs up to the first floor and you are greeted by everyone's favourite part of this house, the upper landing. With its generosity of space affording not only a study area, but also a seating area, this is the spot that naturally draws each and every generation towards it. Upstairs there are a further four bedrooms, two generous doubles. The principal bedroom having both a built-in double door wardrobe and an en-suite, whilst the others share a spacious family bathroom.

Orchard Barn has been a very much loved home from home for all the family for several years, they've loved that Burnham Overy Staithe is just up the track and over the hill.



Burnham Overy
Town is between
Burnham Market,
half a mile to the
west, and Holkham,
three miles to the

east, Burnham Thorpe, the birthplace of Nelson, is a mile to the southeast. King's Lynn is 20 miles away with mainline access to Cambridge and London and Norwich is 30 miles away with its international gateway via Schiphol.

Historically Burnham Overy had been the port for the surrounding villages of the Burnhams. Both Overy Town and Overy Staithe lie on the River Burn, and until the end of the Middle Ages trading ships were able to reach the village of Burnham Overy

Town. Whenever a ship arrived a gong would be sounded at the top of Gong Lane, to alert the farm workers to unload the incoming goods. Perhaps the town's most famous resident was Richard Woodget. He first went to sea in coasters plying the waters off the east coast of England. In 1885 he was appointed captain of the Cutty Sark. He made several record breaking journeys between the UK and Australia.

The village has a fine church originally built in the 13th century. There are no shops but Burnham Market is on the doorstep.
