





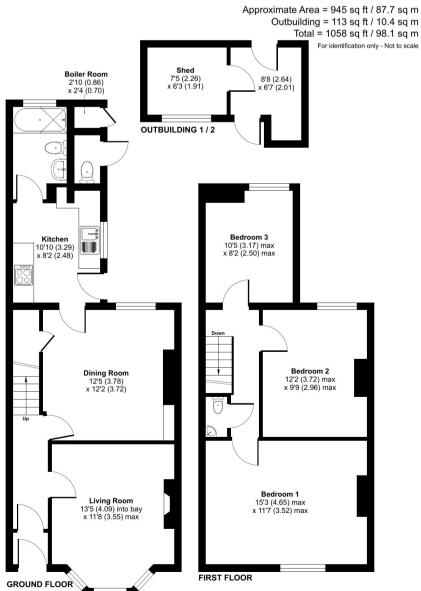

Description

This three-bedroom Victorian mid terrace home is offered to the market with vacant possession and is situated conveniently within easy reach of Taunton town centre. The property offers spacious accommodation arranged over two floors served by uPVC double glazing and mains gas fired central heating.

Internally, a front door leads into entrance hall with staircase rising to the first floor. There is a generous size living room with bay window to front and open fireplace. A separate dining room leads through to a fitted kitchen comprising a range of matching wall and base units, work surfaces and tiled splashbacks with space for a cooker and washing machine. From the kitchen, a doorway leads through to a bathroom which comprises of wc and wash hand basin, bath with perla panelled surround.

To the first floor are three good size bedrooms and a useful Sani flow toilet off the landing.

Externally, to the rear is a fully enclosed, lawned courtyard garden, useful storage shed and gated rear access.
