



Commuter links

Winchcombe is under 10 miles away from Junction 9 (Tewkesbury) of the M5, and is easily accessible via the M/A40 through Oxford and Burford.

Cheltenham is just over eight miles away and is home to the closest mainline train station to Winchcombe, which has services to London, Cardiff, Edinburgh, and Manchester.

Departing every hour, The W bus starts its journey at Delavale Road in Winchcombe and takes you to Cheltenham via, Cleeve Hill, Prestbury and Whaddon.

Education

Winchcombe is a fantastic place to live for families with children. For primary school aged children, Winchcombe Abbey Church of England Primary school is just under a mile away from Merret Place and has an Ofsted rating of 'Outstanding'.

Older children can attend Winchcombe School which is under a mile away and has an Ofsted rating of 'Good'. Established in 1574, Pate's Grammar School, located in Cheltenham, is one of the highest performing schools in the country at A level and GCSE level.

Open spaces

For those who enjoy exploring nature, Winchcombe is a hub for walkers. Surrounded by picturesque countryside and some of the area's best walks, this village is a perfect location for those who love the outdoors.

Winchcombe lies on the route of a number of walking trails such as the Cotswold Way, Winchcombe Way, and Gloucestershire Way. Just a short drive away is Hailes Abbey, an English Heritage Site, where you can enjoy a walk around its ruins, and in the summer months, visitors can pick their own fruit, or enjoy a cream tea at the nearby Hayles Fruit Farm.

For family days out, Cotswold Farm Park is just a few miles from Winchcombe where you can meet over 50 breeds across several different species of British farm animals, including Golden Guernsey goats and Highland cattle.

A bit of history

Winchcombe dates back to Neolithic times, and has been home to kings, monks, and merchants, each leaving their own stamp on the village's landscape and culture.

Sudeley Castle is one of the village's most famous landmarks, which dates back to the 8th Century. The castle was once home to Katherine Parr, the last and only surviving wife of Henry VIII, who died within the castle and is buried in St Mary's Chapel in its grounds.

Another famous site is Winchcombe Abbey, which was also founded in the 8th Century by Kenulf, the King of Mercia. The abbey was rebuilt in Medieval times and destroyed during the Dissolution of the Monasteries in the 16th Century.

When walking around the town, you'll see several blue plaques showcasing the history of some buildings, including the birthplace of Christopher Merret (also spelt Merrett) who produced the first lists of British birds and butterflies as well as discovering how to add fizz to wine.
