To one side, you'll find a spacious lounge featuring a bay window with a cozy window seat, perfect for enjoying views of the front garden. On the opposite side, a delightful dining room awaits, complete with another bay window and a pleasant seating area.

The hallway has a modern Minton style tile floor which is continuous through to the family room and kitchen.

As you move through the hallway, you'll be greeted by the family room, seamlessly merging into a modern, well-equipped kitchen. The family room boasts a multi-fuel stove and a feature fire surround, creating a warm and inviting atmosphere. The family bathroom on this landing is equally impressive, with a pedestal wash basin, low-level WC, stylish panel bath, tiled flooring and walls, a rear window, and a chrome towel radiator.

The master bedroom is a true retreat, with windows to both the front and side, fitted wardrobes, and an ensuite shower room featuring a step-in shower cubicle, wash basin mounted on a vanity unit, low-level WC, and a chrome towel radiator.

Outside, the property boasts two additional buildings. The first is a single detached garage accessed from the main drive. The second, tucked away at the rear, currently serves as a music studio and workroom but could easily be converted into an annex, as it already has plumbing.

The grounds are equally impressive, with an enclosed lawned garden to the front, screened by high hedges, and an elevated garden area to the rear. Multiple seating areas are scattered throughout, perfect for enjoying the sunny aspect.

Menai Bridge (Welsh: Porthaethwy) is a small but historically important town on the Isle of Anglesey (Ynys Môn), in North Wales. It sits at the narrowest part of the Menai Strait – the waterway separating Anglesey from the mainland of Wales. The town grew significantly around the early 19th century, largely because of the construction of Thomas Telford's Menai Suspension Bridge, which opened in 1826. The bridge was a groundbreaking feat of engineering at the time and made road travel to Anglesey much easier — before that, crossings were risky and difficult.

The town is a mix of historic charm and a slightly modern feel because of its proximity to Bangor University across the Strait. Bangor Hospital is equally close by. It is a relaxed, quite scenic town, and popular with visitors who are touring Anglesey or heading into Snowdonia on the mainland.

Nearby you'll also find Britannia Bridge, another famous crossing, originally built as a railway bridge by Robert Stephenson, later adapted for road traffic too.
