
Victorian elegance reimagined: a landmark Truro residence blending period grace with modern sophistication



























The garden

Outside, the mature gardens form a peaceful haven, perfectly complementing the grandeur of the house. Sweeping lawns, established borders, and a terrace accessed from the kitchen create a wonderful setting for alfresco dining, BBQ's and summer gatherings. The borders are planted with a range of mature trees, bushes and flowers, creating a wonderful wash of colour throughout the year. An ample driveway to the front elevation provides generous off road parking, and to the rear elevation is a detached garage with parking in front.

Location

Positioned on Falmouth Road, an address renowned for its handsome period homes and tree-lined approach, St John's House enjoys an enviable location just a short stroll from Truro's vibrant city centre. Here, boutique shops, cafés, restaurants, and cultural attractions sit alongside excellent schools and transport links, including a mainline connection to London Paddington. Several schools including Truro High School are also within a short distance from the property. The north and south Cornish coastlines are both within easy reach, offering the very best of city and coastal living.

Cornwall

The Duchy of Cornwall offers a range of attractions such as the Eden Project, the National Maritime Museum, the Lost Gardens of Heligan, the Tate Gallery and St Michael's Mount. The Cathedral City of Truro is the main financial and commercial centre of Cornwall. It has a fine range of shops, private schools, college and main hospital (RCH Treliske). Its coastline stretches for over 400 miles, offering everything from world-class surfing at Fistral Beach in Newquay to peaceful, picturesque coves like Kynance and Porthcurno. Despite its coastal seclusion, Cornwall is well connected via the A30, regular mainline train services to London, and flights from Newquay Airport to London as well as offering connections to other UK regional airports and several European destinations.
