This is a rare opportunity to buy a detached bungalow, on the level and with great access to the towns' amenities. Often in Crediton, bungalows can occupy elevated positions but this one, within easy reach of Morrisons, Lidl and public transport, is in Blagdon (opposite the entrance to Meadow Gardens).

It's a compact property with a kitchen/dining room, separate living room and then two bedrooms and a shower room with a large walk in shower. Heating is all electric and there's double glazing throughout. It's been well kept with the added bonus of a new roof (including structural support) in 2010, but may benefit from some cosmetic improvement to suit a new owner. Being sold with no onward chain makes the buying process that bit simpler too.



Outside, there's a good-sized garden to the rear, ideal for those with pets or a keen interest in growing a few vegetables! Concrete pathways give year round access through the garden and to the back door. There's right of access over the adjacent drive (owned by United House next door) which leads to a parking space (owned by Blagdon Bungalow).

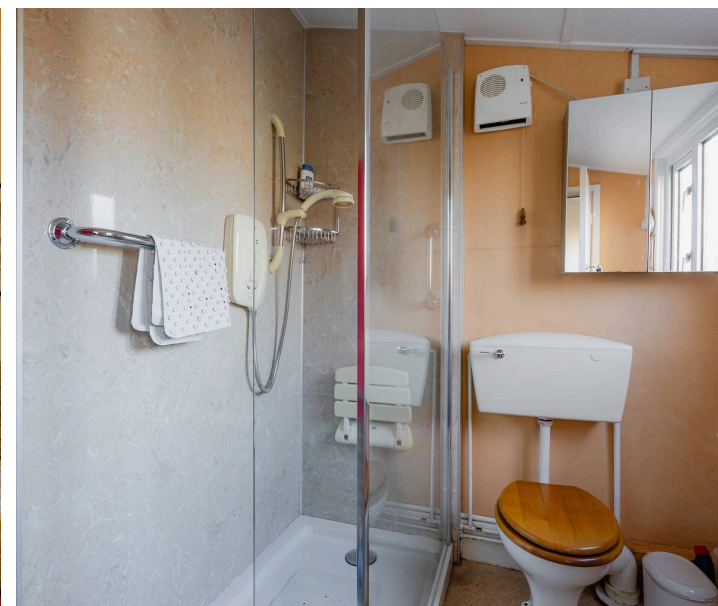

For those commuting it has hassle free transport links into Exeter and for schooling a prestigious secondary school with sixth form (Queen Elizabeth’s).
