### Hallway

Impressive entrance hall with decorative tiles to floor, exposed feature wall, beams to ceiling, stairs down to the lower ground floor and staircase rising to the first floor, useful under stairs storage and door to:-

### Games Room

A cosy room to enjoy a quiet book or a round table game.

### Kitchen/Breakfast Room

Fitted base and wall units incorporating work surface areas and sink with mixer tap over, Aga set within chimney breast, under counter fridge and dishwasher, three windows all with river views, radiator, wall mounted Worcester boiler, beams to ceiling, Oak flooring, 2 small steps down to:-

### VIP Lounge

### On The First Floor

Original wooden turned staircase with feature side window from the hall leads to the first floor landing with doors off and staircase to the 2nd floor.

### The Rigoletto Suite

Evoking the drama and beauty of Verdi's masterpiece, the room is rich with texture, color, and subtle nods to courtly intrigue. ### The Madam Butterfly Suite

### The Royal Box Suite

Stairs rise from the first floor landing to:-

### The La Bohème Suites

One room boasts a romantic double bed, the other, two charming twin beds, perfect for families or friends. A shared, elegant bathroom completes the space. Brimming with artistic flair and youthful spirit, this suite is an ode to love, loss, and la vie bohème.

### On the Lower Ground

Stairs from the entrance hall lead to the lower ground floor with doors off to:-

### Backstage Corridor

Descend into the drama with a corridor inspired by the theatre's backstage. With theatrical lighting and creative touches, it's a clever passage connecting the main living areas to the quieter corners of the house. Along the way, you'll find a compact laundry room—practical but tucked discreetly into the scenery.

### The Orchestra Pit WC

Even the downstairs toilet has its moment in the spotlight. Designed as a cheeky tribute to the orchestra pit, this powder room features a toilet that flushes with a piano key—a delightful surprise for guests and a true conversation starter.

### The Grand Banquet Room

At the corridor's end, the drama swells into a crescendo: a lavish dining hall for 12, made for feasting, toasting, and storytelling into the night. Just beyond, double doors open onto a two-tiered river balcony—the crown jewel of the home.

### The Two-Tier River Balcony

Upper Level: A magical stage in itself, the upper balcony features a large table for 12 beneath overhanging fairy lights, with privacy screens for intimacy and a glass balustrade so you never lose sight of the flowing Dee. It's a space that invites laughter, long evenings, and candlelit memories.

Lower Level: Below, a quieter, covered lounge offers shade and serenity—perfect for morning coffee, evening reflections, or a romantic riverside moment.
