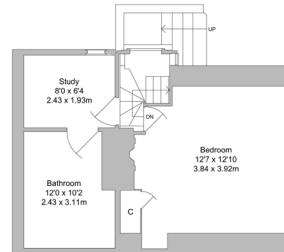
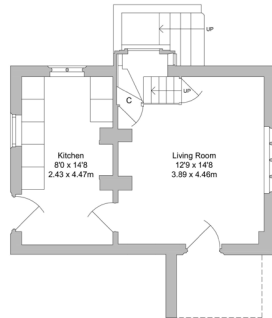
2 Woodgate Lodge, Cliveden Road, Taplow,

The Location

2 Woodgate Lodge is located on the edge of the Cliveden Estate. The Grade II listed property is inscribed with the date of 1857 and the initials of the former owner, Harriet, Duchess of Sutherland, who is thought to be responsible for commissioning the remodelling of the property.

The Cliveden Estate is the former country home of the Astor family and was gifted to the Trust in 1942.

The property is approximately 2.3 miles from the Elizabeth Line at Taplow Station and 4 miles to junction 7 of the M4 with nearby Maidenhead, Burnham, Cookham and Slough offering other local amenities.

From Taplow:

Drive north out of Taplow on the Cliveden Road for approximately 1.5 miles. 1 Woodgate Lodge can be found on the left hand side, slightly set back from the road.

The Property

Ground Floor

Reception Room

Front door opens into Reception Room, with stairs to First Floor and door to kitchen. Front aspect window.

Kitchen

Newly installed kitchen with space for electric cooker, dishwasher, washing machine and fridge freezer. Window overlooking garden. Door leading out to the back of the property.

First Floor

Landing

With half landing providing external door to garden. It opens onto a small covered storm porch with a short flight of steps down. Door to Bedroom and access into Dressing Room/Study.

Bedroom

Double bedroom with large front aspect window and feature fireplace (non-working). Cupboard housing hot water tank.

Dressing Room/Study Area

Flexible space that could be used as a dressing room or study area. Window overlooking garden. Door to Bathroom.

Bathroom

Newly fitted suite comprising of bath with shower over, basin and toilet.

Outside

There is a mature garden, enclosed by fencing and a brick wall, for the private use of the Tenant. There are two allocated parking spaces to the front of the property.

Outgoings and Services

The property benefits from mains electricity with air source heat pump central heating. The property is on a shared septic tank and the water is supplied via the Cliveden Estate. Please note that we reserve the right to twice-yearly recharge the water used based on meter readings and up to a third of the cost of emptying the septic tank. Tenants are to provide their own white goods.

TV and Internet connection must be organised by the tenant.

The Tenant is responsible for all outgoings relating to the property.

Council Tax

The tenant is to pay Council Tax. The property is in Band D for Council Tax and is payable to Buckinghamshire Council. Please be aware an application to the Valuation Office has been made to review the Council Tax banding.

Notes

There is limited mobile signal in the area.

Secondary glazing is due to be installed.

Some garden landscaping works are due to be undertaken.

There is limited head height, low doorways and a steep and narrow staircase.

The Tenancy

Term

The property is available to let under an Assured Shorthold Tenancy for an initial term of 12 months, after which there could be an opportunity for the term to be extended.

Rent

The prospective tenant is asked to pay £1,450 per calendar month. The rent is to be payable by Direct Debit monthly in advance with the first payment being made on the commencement of the tenancy.

Rent reviews

The National Trust carries out rent reviews of the property every two years to open market value.

Deposit

The Tenant will not be required to pay a deposit or a holding deposit

Insurance

The National Trust will be responsible for insuring the building, but the Tenant will be responsible for insuring the contents

Repairing Responsibilities (Summary)

The Trust will be responsible for repairs to the structure, interior and exterior of the building, installations for the supply of services, external decoration, fences, drives, the cost of servicing our appliances.

The Tenant will be responsible for internal decoration and garden maintenance.

Sub Letting

The property shall be occupied as a single private residence only. There will be no right to assign, sub-let or part with possession for the whole or any part of the premises.

Pets

Tenants must seek the landlord's permission for any animals or birds to be kept at the property.

National Trust tenants

As a tenant of the National Trust, you'll receive a free 'tenant pass' throughout the duration of your tenancy. This means that you, your children (under 18) and one other adult can visit the places we care for, for free. Tenant Fees Act 2019 – National Trust Permitted Payments Schedule – 1st June 2019

Permitted Payment	Notes
Deposits	Whilst the receipt of a deposit is a permitted payment under the Tenant Fees Act 2019, for organisational reasons, we do not currently take deposits or holding deposits for our residential lettings.
The Rent	The agreed rent for the property is a permitted payment and payable as per the terms of the Tenancy.
Utilities (Water, Gas, Electricity, Septic Tank)	Tenant/s will be responsible for the payment of Utilities. Where forming part of the letting and as set out in the Tenancy agreement, we may recharge a utility supply to a residential property, including the proportional element of any standing charges and VAT if appropriate. Where properties are not connected to mains drainage, we may recharge the proportional costs of emptying the septic tank to the Tenant/s. In line with the Tenant Fees Act 2019, we may also add an administration charge for Water at £5 per annum for a property without a meter and £10 for a property with a meter.
Council Tax	Tenant/s will be responsible for the payment of council tax. Although these situations are uncommon, we may pay these and recharge these costs to Tenants where appropriate.
Telecoms/Broadband	Tenant/s will be responsible for the payment of their supply of communication costs such as Telecoms and Broadband. The sub-recharging of communications costs such as telephone and broadband are a permitted payment under the Tenant Fees Act 2019, although these situations are uncommon we may recharge these costs to Tenants where appropriate.
Fee for Variation of Tenancy	When requested by the Tenant/s, capped at £50, or reasonable costs incurred if higher as permitted by the Tenant Fees Act 2019.
Early Termination of Tenancy	Where the Tenant/s request the tenancy is terminated early, we may ask the Tenant/s to pay the costs associated with re-advertising the property. The Rent will remain payable until a new Tenancy commences. The costs charged will not exceed the loss or reasonable costs incurred by the Trust.
Default Charges	We may charge interest on late rental payments at the rate set out in Schedule 1, paragraph 4(5) of the Tenant Fees Act 2019
