SITUATION

Woodmead Road is well placed for the main town and the train station both being within walking distance. Axminster is a bustling market town on the eastern fringes of Devon, close to the border with West Dorset and South Somerset. The beautiful Axe Valley with its renowned bird sanctuary reaches the sea at Seaton (6 miles) and the famed beaches of the World Heritage Jurassic Coast and the resort of Lyme Regis are at a similar distance. Exeter (M5) is 24 miles, and Taunton 20 miles. Axminster itself offers a selection of shops including two supermarkets, schooling and train station that is on the direct line to London Waterloo and Exeter. It is also home to Hugh Fearnley-Whittingstall's famous River Cottage.
