Situated in Clock Court, an imposing Victorian building built in the Gothic style, this split-level apartment is steeped in history. The communal entrance halls are striking, with the vaulted ceilings and chandeliers, giving an immediate feeling of grandeur before entering the apartment. Stepping inside the home, you will discover an open plan living area with a fitted kitchen opening to the reception room. Venturing upstairs there is a large bedroom area, fitted wardrobes and a bathroom.

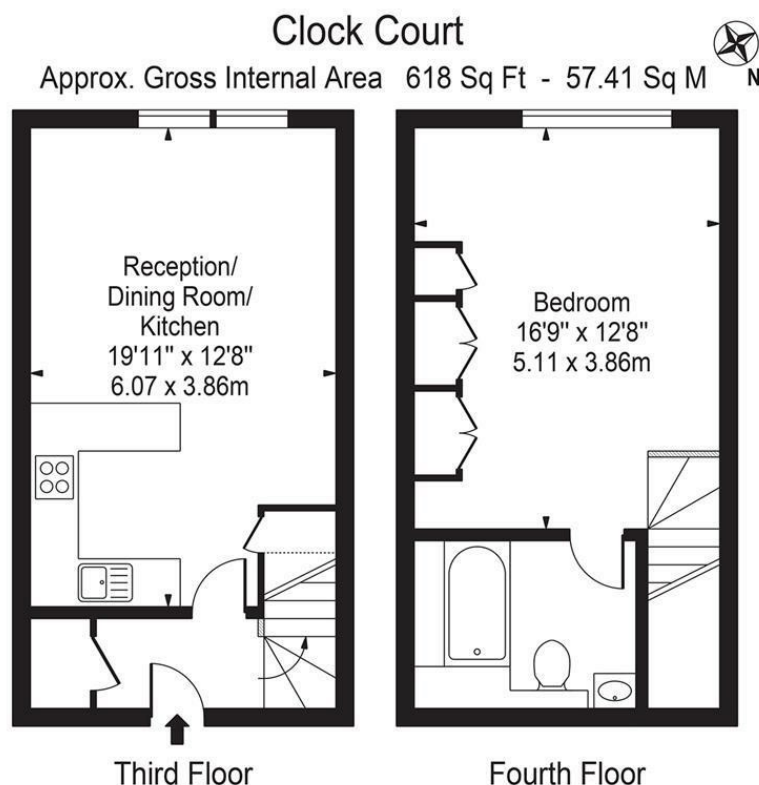
