Immediately upon arrival the warmth of Manor Farmhouse can be felt, emanating from the cream Rayburn, nestled beneath an antique beam, in the sociable kitchen, as exposed stone frames the windows, which invite an abundance of light through.

Country cabinetry offers plenty of fitted storage for all those utensils and essentials. Roll your pastry for home-cooked pies on the tactile solid wood worktops, and dust the flour off your hands with a rinse in the double Belfast sink.
