Moving upstairs to the first floor there are two double bedrooms and a recently refurbished modern family bathroom. The properties third bedroom on the first floor has been converted into a further landing space with stairs allowing access to a double attic bedroom with Velux windows. 
Externally there is an enclosed garden offering a lawned section with mature borders and a raised decking area ideally suited to enjoying the summer months.


Floor Plan
