ACCOMMODATION SUMMARY

Marsh Mills Boathouse is the sort of magical riverside property that comes available once in a generation.

Designed by architects to extend an early-1900s boathouse into a spacious 'New England' style modern family home, the property enjoys a special location with long views down the river towards Henley-on-Thames.



GROUND FLOOR

Inside, Marsh Mills Boathouse offers a modern and expansive open-plan living space with river views, featuring a spacious river room with glass doors leading to a balcony, two dining areas, a garden/sitting room, writing desks, a guest WC, and an open-plan family-style kitchen with a laundry room. The house is both bright and breezy in summer and cosy in winter.















GROUND FLOOR

The ground floor includes a principal bedroom suite with river views, en suite bathroom and dressing room.











FIRST FLOOR

The first floor comprises two large bedrooms and shower rooms (one en suite), and a third writing desk area with a balcony.







OUTSIDE

In the garden there is a self-contained fifth bedroom with a fully fitted kitchen, with a separate sitting room and shower room, perched above the river with stunning views.





OUTSIDE

Park your cars in the courtyard complete with a self-contained mews flat above a double-garage and access the main property via a footbridge over the millstream where an acre of immaculate gardens with some 200 metres of river and millstream frontage surround the house. The gardens feature several outdoor lounging and dining spaces with beautiful river views while retaining privacy from passing boats.







OUTSIDE

Keep your riverboat and paddle boards in the boathouse and enjoy lazy summer evenings on the river or potter into Henley by boat. Marsh Mills Boathouse is more than a property – it's a lifestyle that is just an hour's drive from central London. Viewing is highly recommended.

TRANSPORT

Henley on Thames benefits from a convenient rail connection, providing a gateway to numerous destinations. The Henley-on-Thames railway station, operated by Great Western Railway (GWR), offers regular services to Twyford (a 7-minute drive away from the property). From Twyford, travellers can connect to the main line services towards London Paddington, Reading, and beyond. The journey to London Paddington takes approximately one hour, making Henley an attractive base for commuters and day-trippers alike. There are direct trains to and from Paddington in just 27 minutes. On the Elizabeth Line you can reach Bond Street in 52 minutes directly, and Canary Wharf in 68 minutes.

For those heading towards Oxford or the West Country, connections at Reading provide access to a wide range of destinations. With frequent services and reliable schedules, rail travel remains a popular and efficient mode of transport for those in Henley on Thames.

Henley on Thames is well-served by an extensive road network, making car travel a viable option for many. The town is accessible via the A413O, which links to the M4 motorway at junction 8/9 for those travelling from London or the west. The M4O motorway, another major route, is also within easy reach, providing connections to Birmingham and the Midlands.

For drivers, the town offers several car parks, including long-stay and short-stay options. This makes it convenient for visitors to park and explore Henley's attractions, such as the River and Rowing Museum, Henley Bridge, and the historic market square.

Given its riverside location, Henley on Thames is also accessible by water. The River Thames offers a unique mode of transport, with boat services and private hire options available. During the summer months, regular boat trips operate between Henley and nearby towns such as Marlow and Windsor, allowing travellers to enjoy a leisurely journey along the river.
