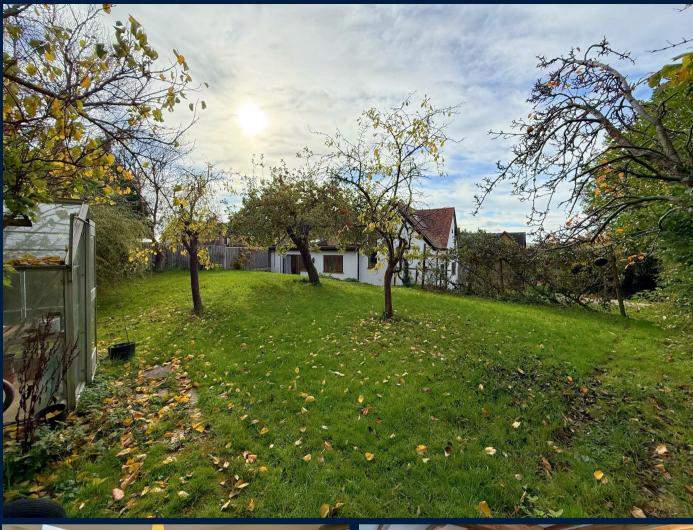

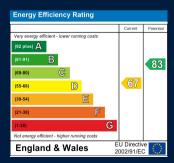
Floor Plan
