SITUATION:

Monkshill, located in the village of Hernhill near Faversham, is a peaceful rural setting surrounded by open countryside and working farmland. The area is known for its natural beauty, walking routes, and relaxed pace of life, making it ideal for those seeking a quieter lifestyle while remaining well connected. Despite its tranquil feel, Monkshill benefits from close proximity to Faversham's historic town centre, with its independent shops, cafés and markets, as well as easy access to the coast, including Seasalter and the popular seaside town of Whitstable.

The nearby town of Faversham offers a far wider range of shopping, leisure, and recreational amenities, including an indoor and outdoor swimming pool, a cinema, a museum and numerous good pubs and restaurants. The town is served by a good selection of primary schools and two secondary schools, one of which being the renowned Queen

Elizabeth Grammar School. A wider selection of state, grammar and private schools can be found and Canterbury and both Faversham and Canterbury have mainline stations with a high speed link to London St Pancras. The bustling seaside town of Whitstable lies just five miles away and is renowned for its rich maritime heritage, thriving food scene, and laid-back coastal charm. Famed in particular for its fresh seafood, the town comes alive during the annual Whitstable Oyster Festival, a much-loved celebration that draws visitors from across the region. Centred around its vibrant harbour and picturesque quayside, Whitstable offers a delightful mix of working fishing boats, independent boutiques, cafés, and acclaimed restaurants. The town's shingle beaches and colourful beach huts provide a scenic backdrop for coastal walks and sunsets, while its creative, welcoming atmosphere makes it a highly desirable destination to visit or enjoy year-round.



A charming detached four-bedroom Victorian residence, originally built in the mid-1800s, this unique home has been thoughtfully and creatively extended over time to provide over 1,600 sq ft of characterful accommodation. Rich in period features, the property showcases original fireplaces, intricate architraves, and beautifully panelled internal doors, blending historic charm with modern living. Once two separate cottages, the property now stands as an impressive and cohesive detached home, centrally positioned within approximately 0.37 acres of picturesque grounds. The gardens are a true highlight, featuring an abundance of fruit trees, established vegetable patches, and expanses of manicured lawn, creating a wonderfully self-sufficient and tranquil outdoor environment.

The façade is particularly attractive, with its white-rendered exterior, dark slate roof, and symmetrical sash windows, all centred around a traditional chimney stack. A soft green front door set beneath an elegant, pitched porch, framed by neat hedging and

carefully curated planting, offers a warm and inviting first impression in this peaceful semi-rural setting.

Upon entering, the welcoming entrance hall, currently utilised as a home office, retains a strong sense of character, with a central fireplace set within the chimney breast and bespoke cabinetry fitted neatly into the alcoves. To the rear, the extended kitchen/breakfast room forms the heart of the home, flooded with natural light from extensive glazing that frames views of the garden. The kitchen is fitted with a range of sleek gloss units, complemented by granite worktops and fully integrated appliances. A central island incorporates an induction hob with a downdraft extractor, while a stylish bar area with wine fridge and mirrored splashback adds a sociable and contemporary touch. The space is further complimented by a well appointed utility room and WC. Adjacent, the dining room features bifold doors opening onto the west facing garden, perfectly positioned to enjoy the evening sun. This space flows seamlessly into the sitting

room, where an ornate period fireplace and front-facing sash window create a cosy yet elegant living area. Upstairs, a central landing leads to four well-proportioned double bedrooms, each enjoying delightful views over the surrounding countryside. These are served by a well-appointed family bathroom, completing the first-floor accommodation. The principal bedroom leads through to a dressing room which in turn steps down into a ensuite bathroom.

OUTSIDE:

Monkshill Cottage sits within an attractive 0.37-acre plot that gently wraps around the property, offering generous parking to both the front and left-hand side. The main garden is predominantly laid to lawn, thoughtfully complemented by fruit trees and well-maintained vegetable beds, creating a charming and productive outdoor space. To the west of the property, bifold doors open onto a delightful sun terrace, complete with a pergola, an ideal spot for outdoor dining and relaxation.

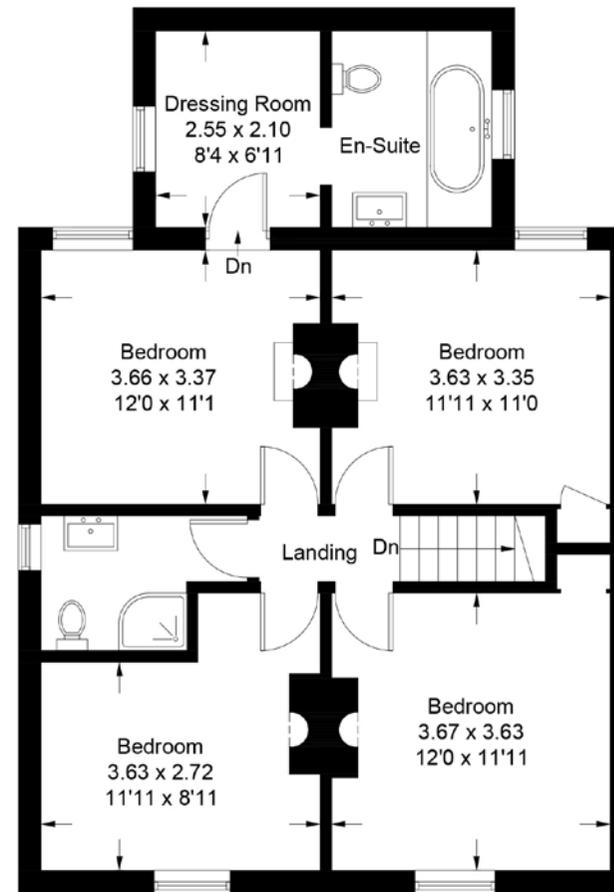
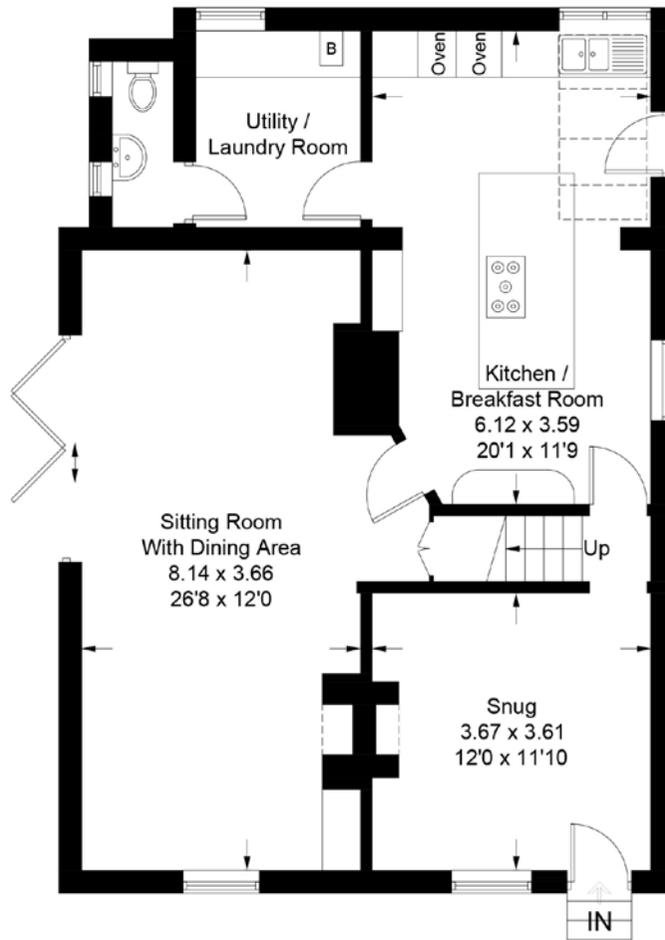
