A welcoming entrance hall, comprising off double glazed uPVC entrance door to front aspect, 18mm solid oak flooring, rose ceiling light, carpeted stairs to first floor landing, decorative cornice archway, radiator and doors allowing access to ground floor reception rooms

Double glazed bay fronted window, carpeted flooring, ceiling light, wall sockets, TV point, wall mounted electric fireplace, and radiator

Dining Room

Double glazed window to rear aspect. 18mm solid oak flooring, ceiling light, radiator, wall sockets, and two inset alcoves with fitted shelving

Kitchen

20' 3" x 8' 4" (6.17m x 2.54m)
A contemporary and well-appointed kitchen, with 2 x double glazed windows to side aspect. A range of wall and base units and corner shelving, with complimentary marble effect worksurfaces over, built in double oven, gas hob and concealed extractor over, 1.5 bowl composite sink and drainer with mixer taps, space for dishwasher, space for free standing American style fridge/freezer, tiled flooring, radiator, power points, strip ceiling light, original wooden beamed ceiling, and double glazed uPVC single door allowing access to rear garden

Double glazed opaque window to side aspect. W/C ceiling light and wood flooring

Double glazed window to front aspect, carpeted flooring, ceiling light, wall sockets, radiator, and walk in wardrobe.

Bedroom Three

8' 9" x 10' 4" (2.67m x 3.15m)
Double glazed window to rear aspect, carpeted flooring, ceiling light, wall sockets, and radiator

Bedroom Four

7' 7" x 8' 6" (2.31m x 2.59m)
Double glazed window to side aspect, carpeted flooring, ceiling light, fitted dressing table, wall sockets and radiator

Family Bathroom

Double glazed opaque window to side aspect, panelled bath, W/C, wash hand basin, built in shower cubicle, heated towel radiator, extractor fan, partially tiled walls, and loft access

Second Floor Accommodation

Bedroom One

Double glazed window to front aspect, carpeted flooring, 2 x ceiling lights, wall sockets, radiator, and fitted wardrobe

Rear Garden

A spacious courtyard garden to rear, enclosed by a sturdy brick-built wall boundary, providing added privacy. The garden is predominantly laid with a paved patio area, offering low maintenance and provides plenty of space for outdoor dining and entertaining. To the rear, is a uPVC and double glazed storage shed and a gate to the rear allows for easy exit and entry to the rear of the property

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


