



Red Cottage Naphill Common

Naphill, High Wycombe

Naphill is a lovely village between High Wycombe and Princes Risborough and has an array of shops that provide for all day to day needs including a Post Office, mini-market, beauty/hair salon, active village hall with adjoining playing field, coffee shop and public house. The larger towns of High Wycombe and Princes Risborough provide a wider variety of shops and leisure facilities as well as a mainline rail link to London. The M40 is easily accessible at High Wycombe (junction 4). Naphill is surrounded by beautiful Chilterns countryside with numerous country walks and bridleways through the areas famed Beech woodland.

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

This charming four bedroom semi-detached cottage, dating back to the mid 19th century, offers a rare blend of period character and rural tranquillity in the heart of beautiful Naphill Common. Once serving as a game keeper's residence, the property retains a wealth of original features, including, traditional doors, fireplace and windows, all thoughtfully maintained to preserve its heritage. The heart of the home is a wonderful country kitchen and dining area, fitted with bespoke shaker-style units, a walk-in-pantry, quarry tile flooring, and a classic Aga, creating an inviting space for family gatherings. The spacious living room boasts a wood-burning stove set within a slate hearth, while the accommodation flows seamlessly throughout the ground floor. Upstairs, four well-proportioned bedrooms provide serene meadow or woodland views, whilst the traditional family bathroom is fitted with both a bath and shower. Additional features include a separate utility room, cloakroom and welcoming entrance porch, ideal for those muddy boots. This enchanting cottage combines timeless charm with modern comforts, all within easy reach of local amenities including a welcoming café, traditional public houses, and a village shop.
