On the ground floor, the layout provides a generous living room to the front, a separate dining room to the rear, a galley kitchen with access to the garden, and a family bathroom. Upstairs, three well proportioned bedrooms are arranged across the first floor. To the rear, the property benefits from an enclosed garden, a real asset for families. The property also features double glazing throughout and driveway parking for two vehicles.

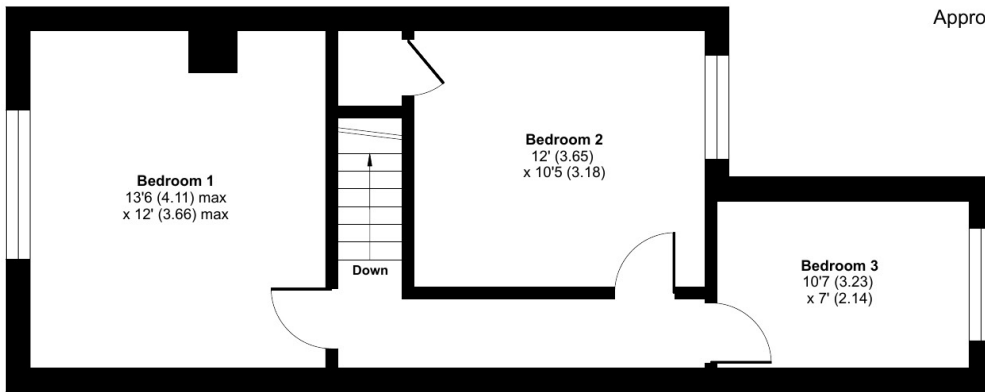




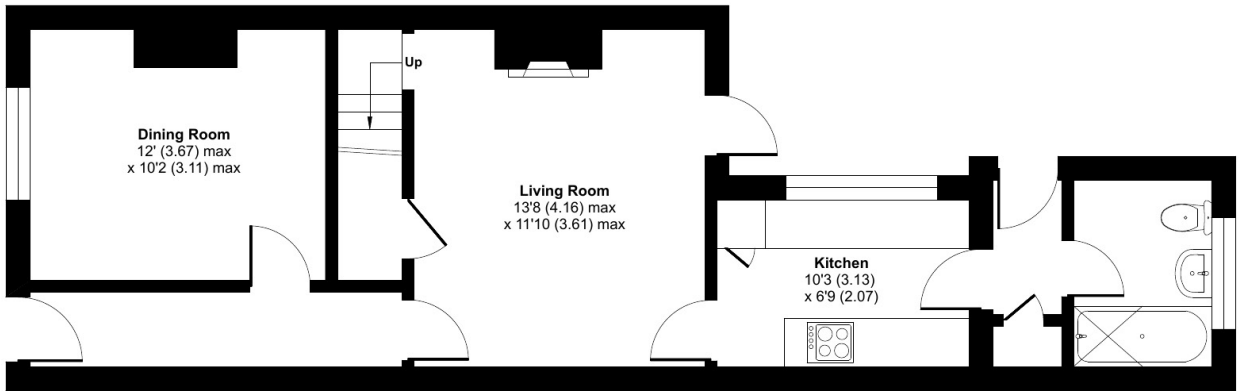








FIRST FLOOR

Ground Floor

Living Room: (4.16m x 3.61m) A generous front-facing reception room with good natural light, currently used as a bedroom as part of the existing HMO arrangement, but readily returning to its natural use as a living room.

Dining Room: (3.67m x 3.11m) A well-proportioned rear reception room opening through to the kitchen, ideal as a dining room or family space, with direct access to the garden.

Kitchen: (3.13m x 2.07m) Fitted galley kitchen with units, gas hob, extractor, space for a washing machine, and door to the rear garden.

Family Bathroom: A ground floor family bathroom comprising a panelled bath, pedestal basin, and WC, with part-tiled walls and a window to side.

Bedroom 2: (3.65m x 3.18m) A well-sized second double bedroom with good natural light, carpet flooring, and plenty of space for storage.
