The *story*

Canary Wharf is home to some of the tallest buildings in Britain: One Canada Square, HSBC Tower, and Citigroup Centre. But if you travelled back in time to the 1930s, you'd never have guessed that glitz and prestige were on the cards for this humble industrial area.

Canary Wharf takes its name from berth No. 32 of the Import Dock. Built in 1936 for Fruit Lines, this is where huge quantities of goods were imported, including fruit from the Canary Islands — hence the name.

Today, Canary Wharf's cluster of skyscrapers in east London is a thriving business district

diversifying from purely financial businesses residing here, to life sciences, technology, real estate, transport and energy.

But that's not the end of the Wharf's story. In recent years, the Estate reinvented itself by making a home for retail, leisure, and art. With the largest collection of outdoor public art in London, a calendar packed with events and award-winning festivals, and an ever-growing list of activities, Canary Wharf does everything in superlatives. It has also become a place for people to live — not just to be close to work, but because of the fantastic leisure opportunities on the doorstep.

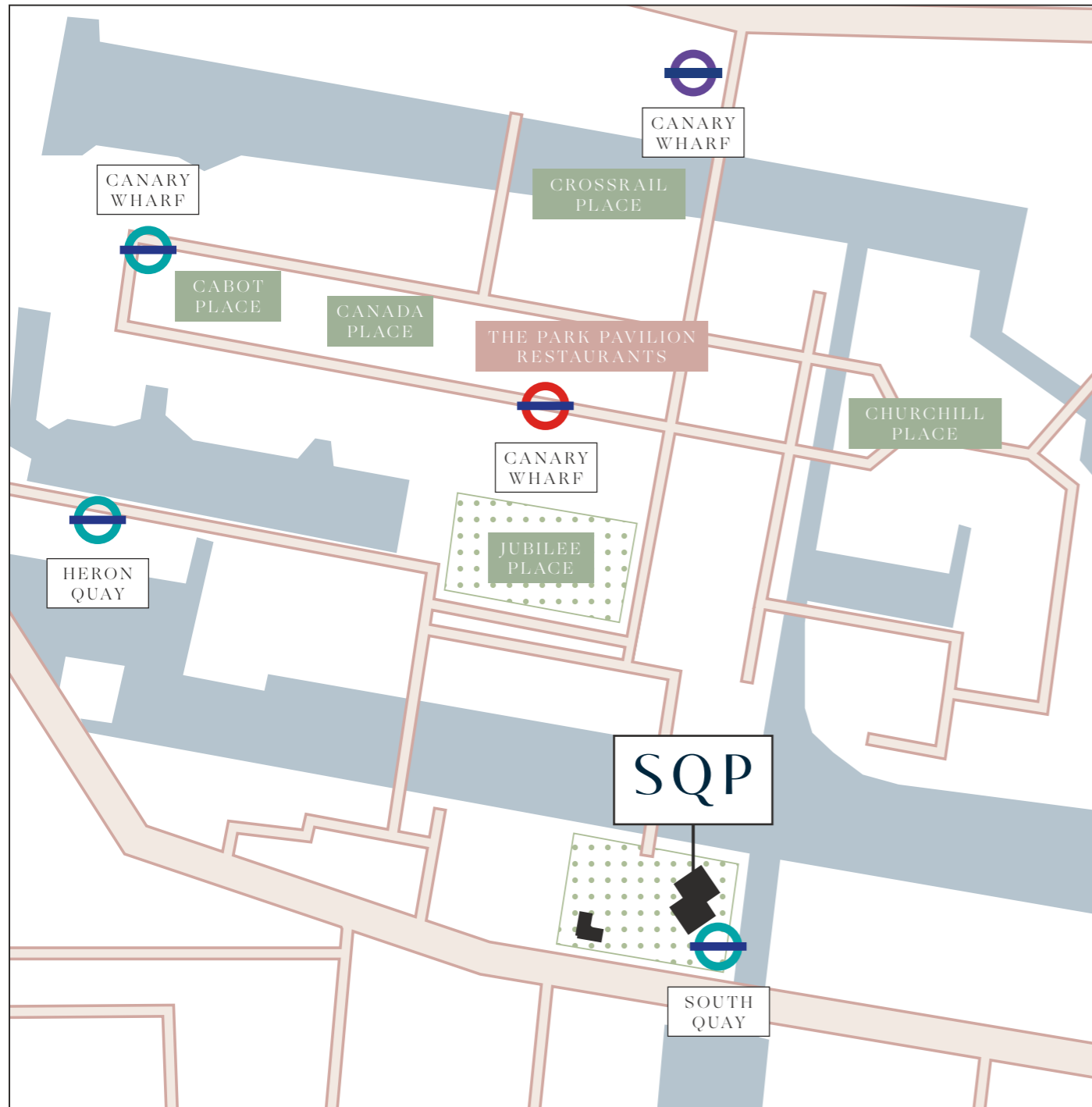

ROKA

Taking inspiration from robata-yaki, a Japanese method of cooking on charcoal, ROKA serves food and drinks around a central open grill.

Sit at the bar to get a front row seat on the sizzling action or retreat to the leafy outdoor terrace for dramatic skyline views. Besides grill dishes, you can sample sushi, sashimi, and nigiri.

PLATEAU

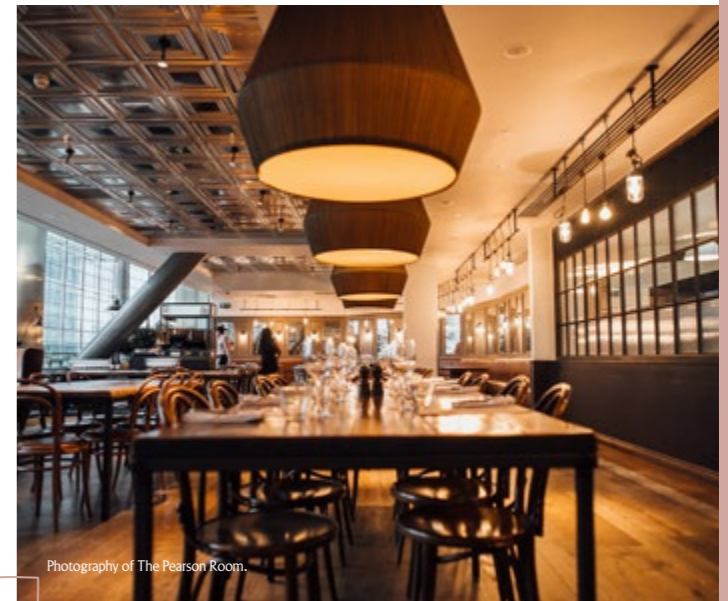

Sustainable dining never looked so stylish. Settle into a comfy velvet booth with cosy mood lighting and retro finishes, then dig into the hearty fare. The menu features your usual suspects, such as ribeye, sirloin, and rump, as well as speciality cuts: tire de ancho slow grilled with chimichurri; churrasco de chorizo marinated in garlic, parsley, and olive oil; and spiral cut fillet.

Want the kids to fall in love with the outdoors? The Youth Club organises after school, weekend, and half-term courses for children of all ages to introduce kids to watersports through fun games.

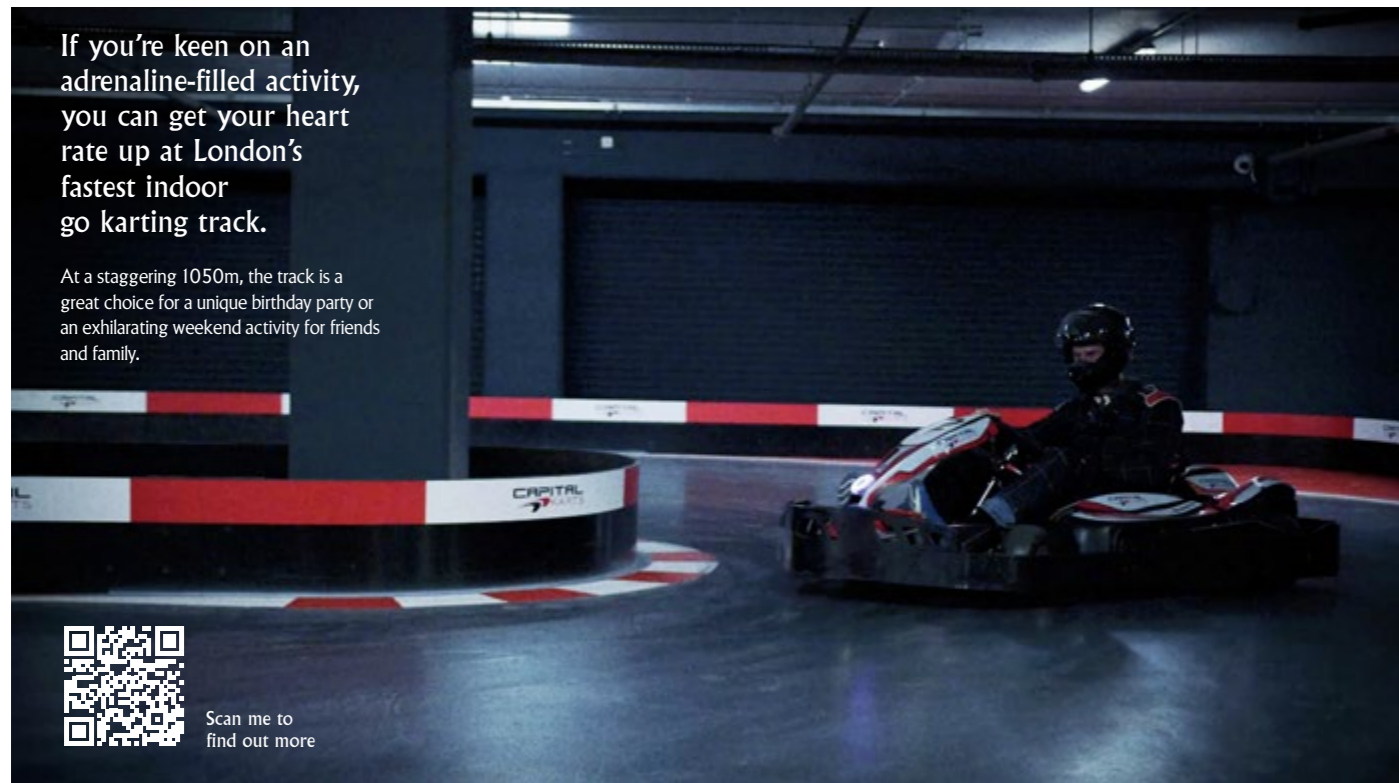




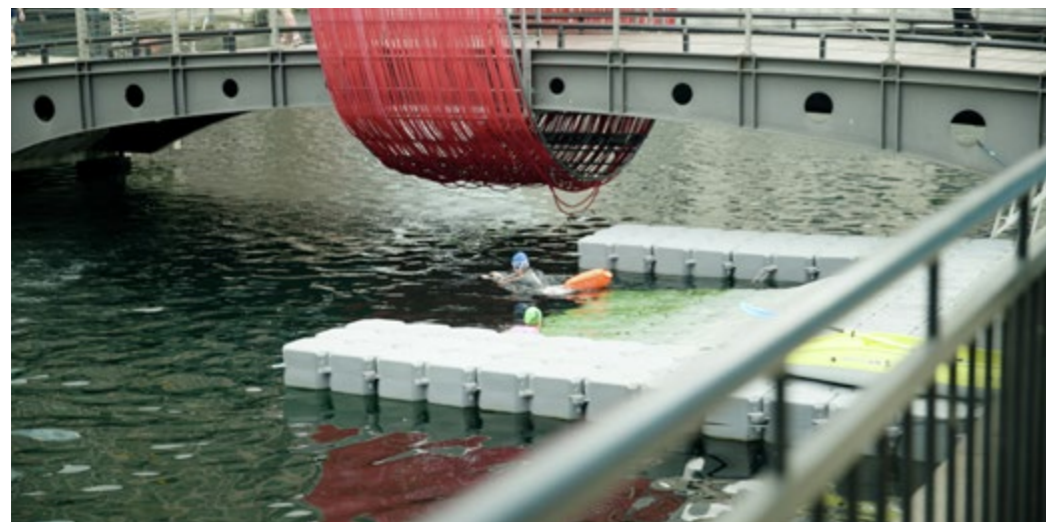
Ready, Get Set...GO!

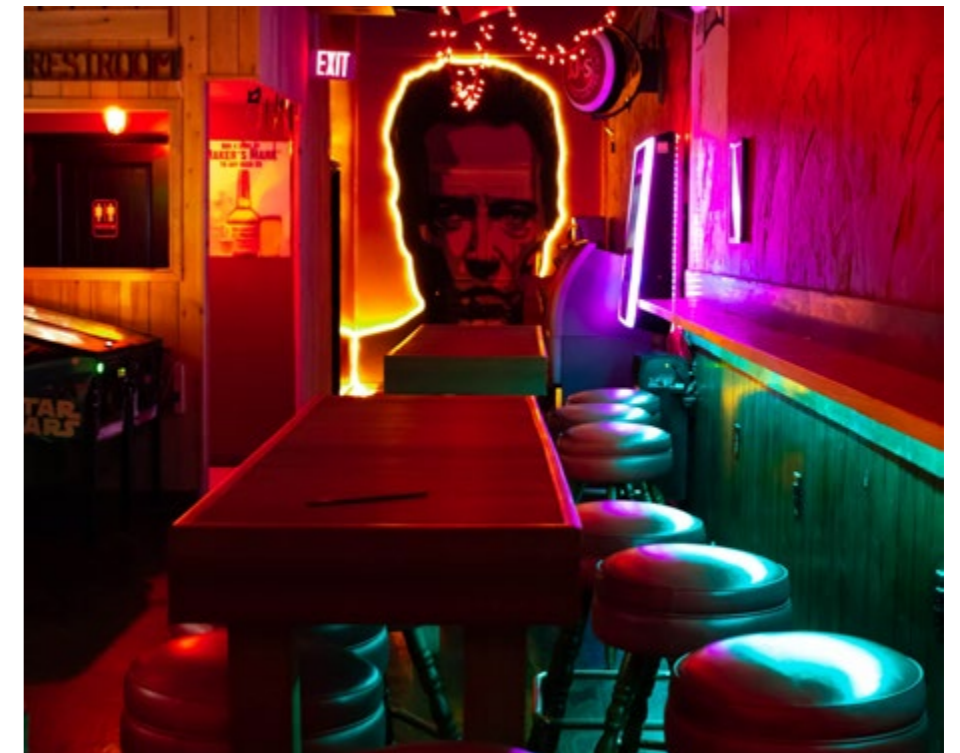

Welcome to one of London's largest parks. Wander underneath the impressive canopy structure and admire plants from all over the world, from Asian bamboo to American ferns. Hidden paths and quiet hideaways make it a perfect place to read a book, relax, and quiet your mind.

In summer, Crossrail Place Roof Garden partners up with the Space Theatre for an action-packed Bloom festival. The 80-seater performance space brings the community together through live music, theatre, and workshops. All events are free.

Canary Wharf *parks*

The Wharf is a coveted slice of nature in the city — green spaces such as landscaped parks, plazas, and walkways make 20% of the total area. Relaxing water features and pleasant shaded spaces make Jubilee Park a popular choice for a picnic in the sun or an outdoor yoga session. Meanwhile, art installations and children's play areas at Harbour Quay Gardens will keep the whole family entertained, with the dizzying skyline panorama as your backdrop. For long walks or jogging, head to Sir John Mcdougall Gardens, where you'll find scenic waterfront pathways.

ART FOR ALL!

There are over 100 pieces of art installed around Canary Wharf, making it London's largest outdoor collection of art. You can download the map of installations from the Canary Wharf website and go on a treasure hunt to find them all (there is also a shorter Children's Art Trail for the little ones).

Some are hard to miss, like Ron Arad's Windwand, a 50-metre red needle as tall as some of the buildings surrounding it. Others are hidden in plain sight, like the phantasmagorical fruit by Victor Seaward that simultaneously functions as sculptures and bird nests. Spotting them is half the fun, inviting you to look at the familiar surroundings with curious eyes.

In addition to permanent artworks, Canary Wharf hosts temporary exhibitions. Perhaps the most beloved one is the Winter Lights festival which lights up the dark January evenings with spectacular light installations. The 2023 festival edition will see 20 artworks by international artists, including pieces never before seen in the UK.

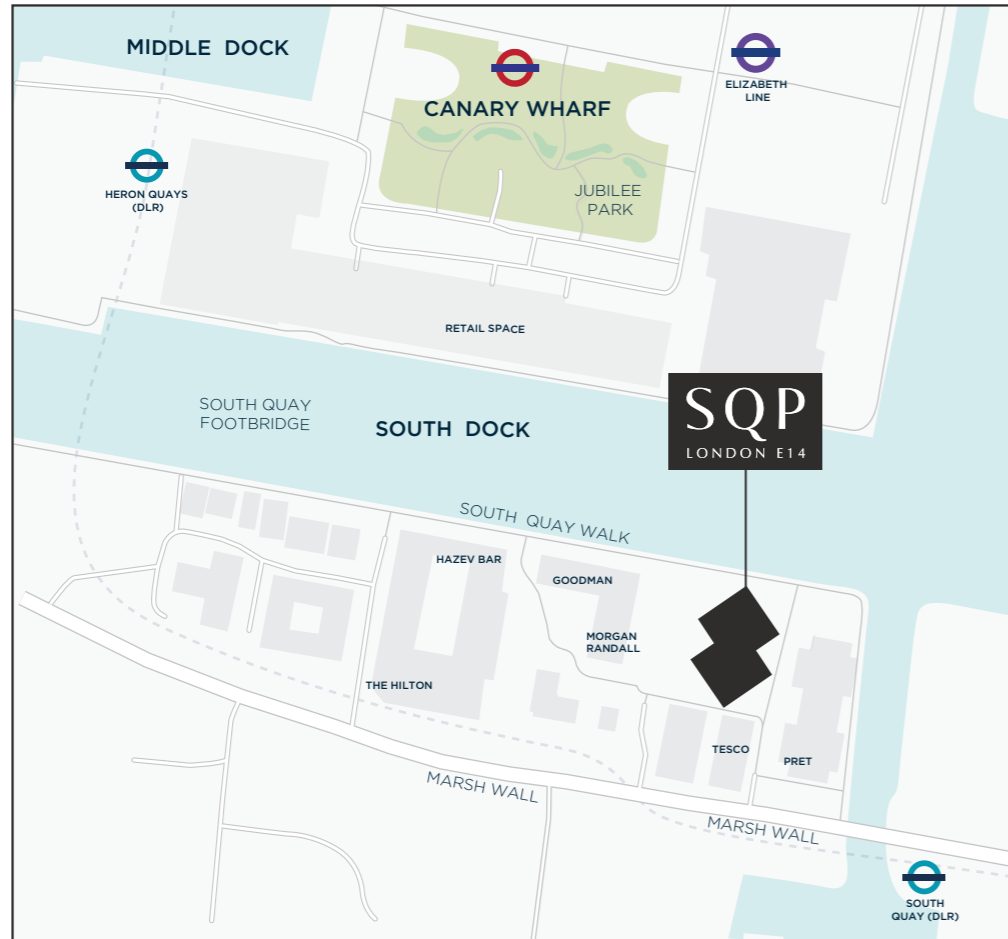
