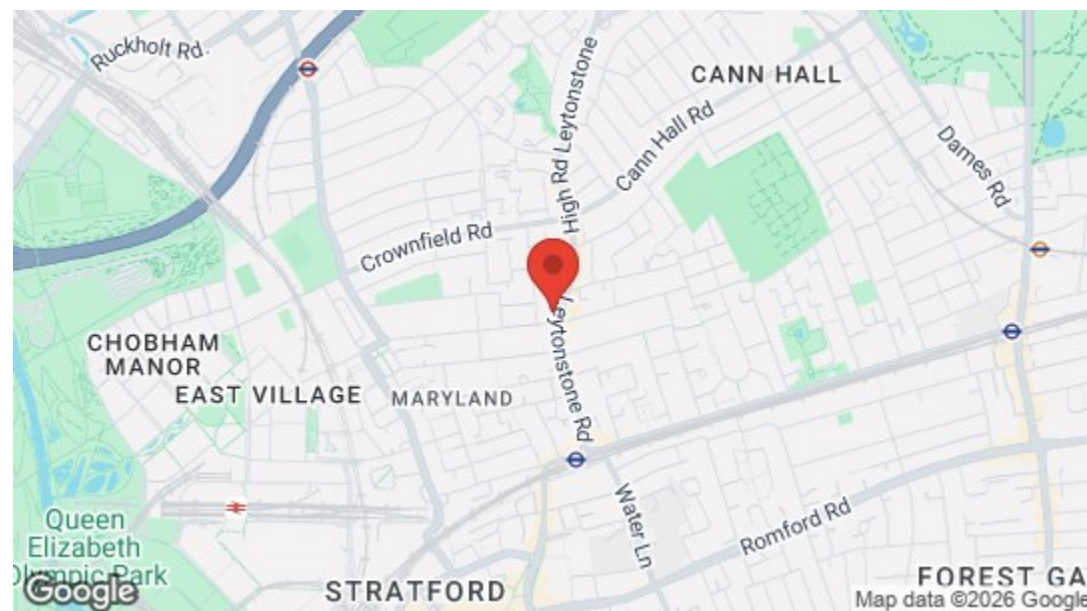

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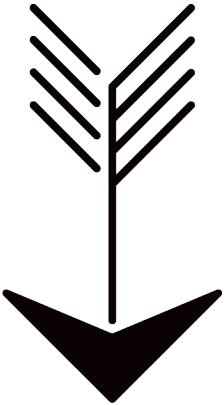

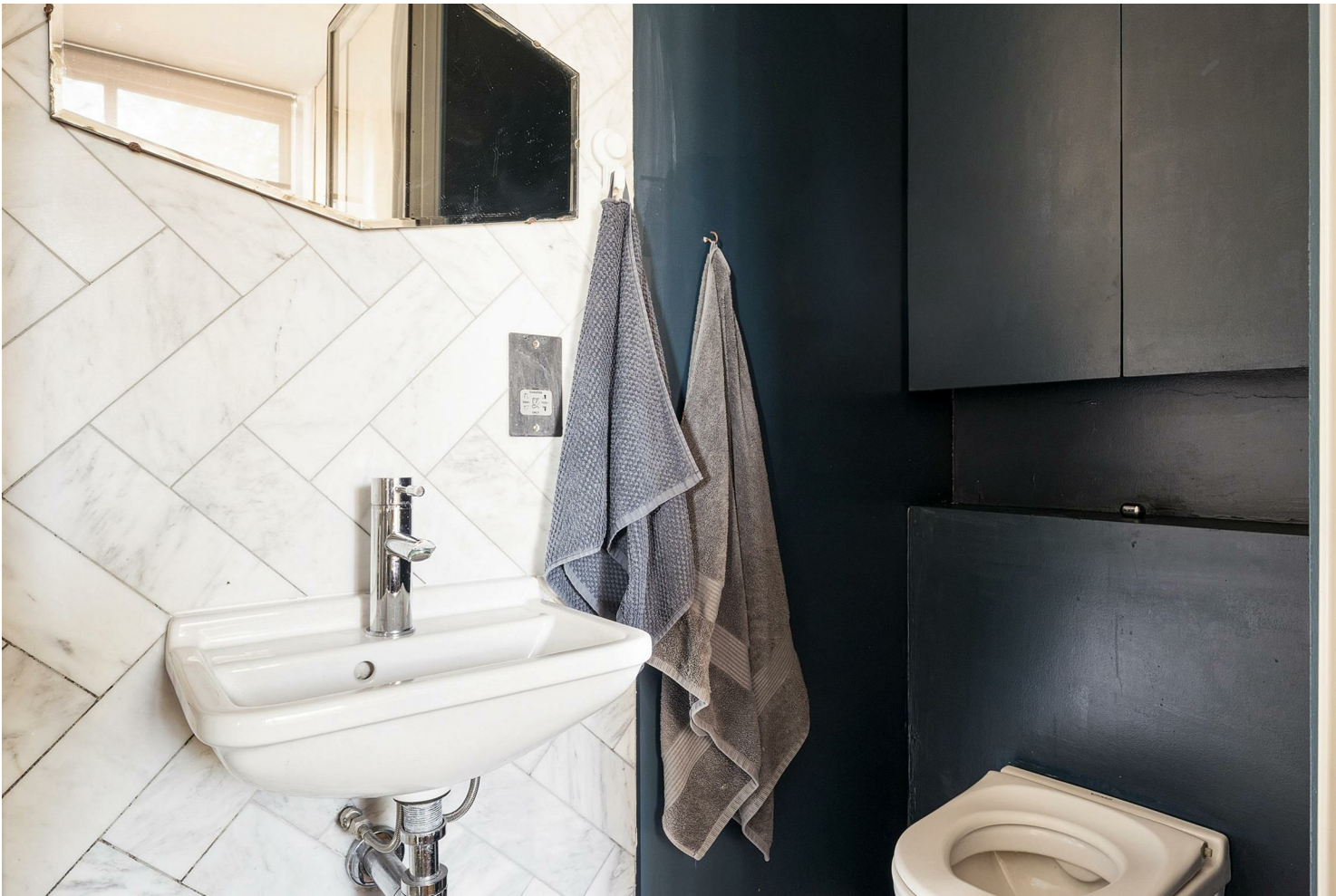


A WORD FROM THE OWNER...

➡ IF YOU LIVED HERE...

The front door opens directly into the kitchen/reception room, a bright, sociable space with a broad bay window drawing in plenty of natural light. Timber flooring runs underfoot, while the kitchen sits neatly along the rear wall, with deep blue cabinetry, warm timber worktops and tiled splashbacks. There's ample room to create distinct lounging and dining areas, making the space feel particularly versatile for everyday life.

Beyond, the shower room is finished with marble-effect tiling, contrasting dark walls and black fittings, while the double bedroom sits peacefully at the rear. Here, pale timber cabinetry provides storage, with space for a desk alongside the bed. Crittall-style glazed doors open directly onto the private garden, creating a lovely connection between indoors and out. The garden itself is a wonderfully secluded spot, with mature greenery, a characterful brick boundary wall and paved space for outdoor dining.

WHAT ELSE?

- Stratford puts a huge amount within easy reach, from the shops, restaurants and cinema at Westfield Stratford City to the cafés and independent spots around nearby East Village.
- For green space, you have West Ham Park nearby, while the Queen Elizabeth Olympic Park offers plenty more room for walking, cycling and spending time outdoors.
- Maryland Station is moments away, providing Elizabeth line services across London, while Stratford adds Central and Jubilee lines, DLR, Overground and National Rail connections.
