Tucked quietly away in the heart of the ever-popular village of Freethorpe, this charming semi-detached barn conversion is discreetly positioned at the end of a private driveway, creating a wonderfully private setting that feels both peaceful and secluded. With beautiful countryside views stretching across open fields to the rear, the home perfectly blends characterful period features with generous and flexible living space.

The property opens into a welcoming hallway that connects the principal ground-floor rooms. At the heart of the home is the kitchen, a particularly characterful space where traditional Norfolk pamments line the floor, complemented by exposed brickwork and impressive timber beams that highlight the building's heritage. The kitchen flows naturally into the adjacent dining room, creating a sociable area ideal for everyday living and entertaining.

The sitting room is a superbly proportioned reception space, enjoying excellent natural light and offering plenty of room for comfortable seating arrangements. From here, the layout of the home continues to provide flexibility, with a study on the ground floor that could equally serve as a playroom or occasional bedroom if required, accompanied by a convenient ground-floor shower room.


Upstairs, the property offers three well-proportioned bedrooms arranged around the landing. The principal bedroom enjoys the benefit of its own en-suite, while the remaining bedrooms are served by a family bathroom. Each room retains the sense of character expected from a barn conversion while providing comfortable and practical accommodation.

Externally, the property continues to impress. To the rear, there is good sized garden main laid to lawn. A detached garage and outbuilding provide additional versatility.

Freethorpe

IDYLIC YET CONNECTED VILLAGE
LIFE

The quiet village of Freethorpe is a rural sanctuary in the sprawling Norfolk Broads National Park, located just 16 miles East of the diverse city of Norwich and only 4 miles from the town of Acle, it is within easy commuting distance. Not only is the village well connected by road, it is central to a host of rail stations, the closest being Reedham, with regular trains direct to Norwich. For those seeking adventure on the endless Norfolk coastline, there are regular services to both Great Yarmouth and Lowestoft from respective stations.

Freethorpe is home to All Saints Church which is one of 124 existing round-tower churches in Norfolk. For history lovers there are a range of historical sites close by, including Caister Castle, Burgh Castle and Strumpshaw Steam Museum.

With a choice of award winning adventure parks just minutes from Freethorpe, the village is a prime location for family days out. Petits Animal Adventure Park is just 2.5 miles away and Thrigby Hall and Bewilderwood are just a short drive.

Whether you prefer to hire a boat, paddle your way along the broads or enjoy tramping through the marshy expanses of the River Yare, with very few roads crossing the area, it is one of the most remote in the broads. Grab your binoculars and spotting books, as such the paths along the banks are prime for spotting rare and common bird species, protected by the RSPB.

Freethorpe is a thriving village with a “Good” Ofsted rated school. Amenities such as shops and doctors’ surgery can be found in near by Acle as well as a range of local produce outlets dotted around the Broadlands area.
