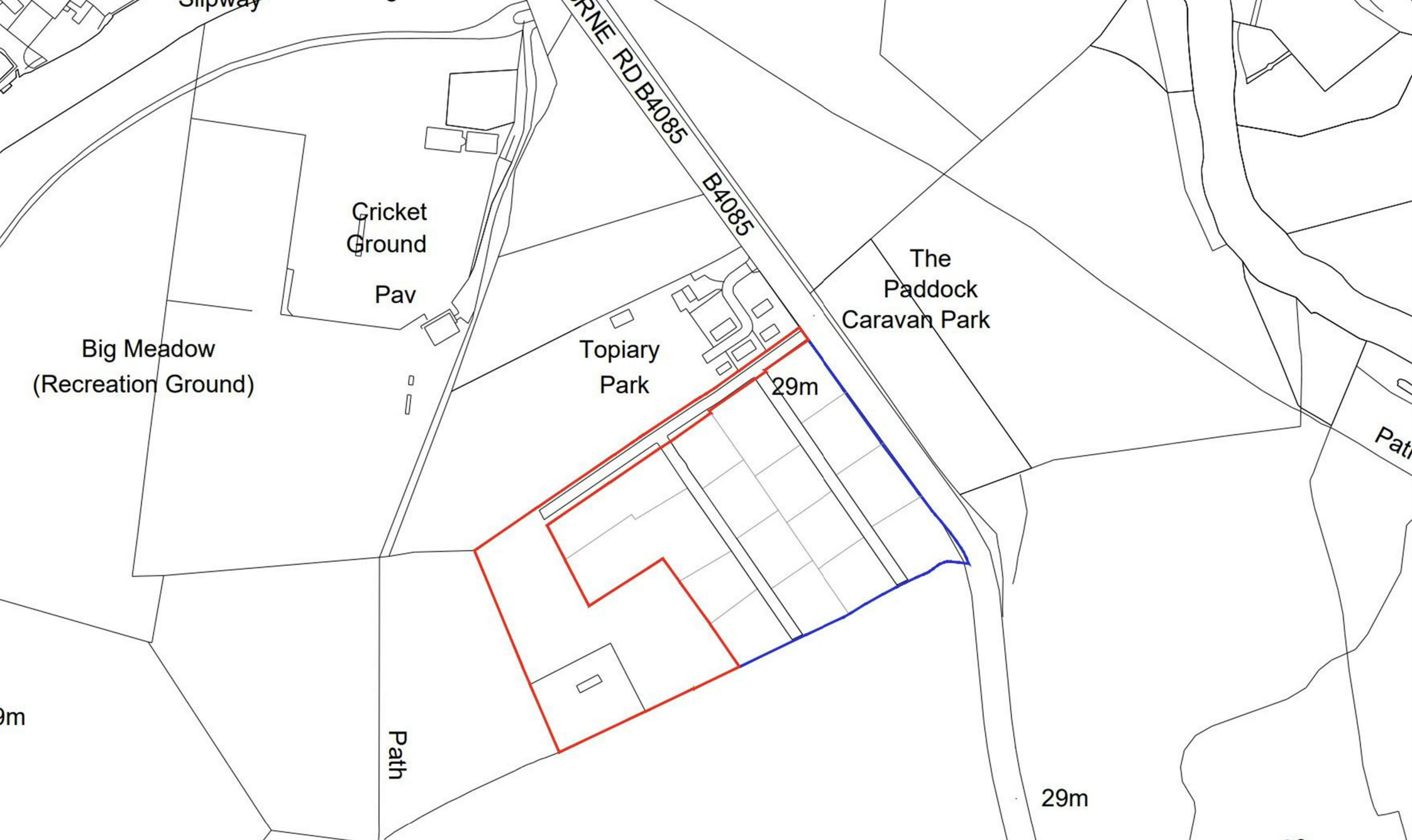

The level parcel extends to approximately 3 acres and is predominantly laid to pasture, making it suitable for grazing and a variety of other agricultural or equestrian uses, subject to the necessary permissions where applicable.
